Board Member Ethics

The following ethical principles are expected of all individual Board members. A school board member, operating under the highest of ethical standards, should:

- 1. Assure the highest possible educational opportunity for every student.
- 2. Observe local, state and federal laws and regulations pertaining to education.
- Accept office as a Board member as a means of unselfish service and seek no personal financial gain.
- 4. Take official actions only in public sessions.
- 5. Represent the entire community without fear or favor.
- 6. Remember at all time that he/she is one member of an educational team.
- 7. Maintain privileged information with the strictest of confidence from closed session to information learned through Board work regarding staff and students.
- Recognize that the strength of a Board is as a Board, not as individuals.
- 9. Delegate authority to the Superintendent as the Board's executive and confine Board action to policymaking, finances, planning, and appraisal.
- 10. Use the chain-of-command when citizens present concerns, so that they are addressed at the lowest level possible, by the individual closest to the situation.
- 11. Speak with forethought about staff or fellow Board members in the public.
- 12. Employ only competent and trained personnel.
- 13. Preserve the obligation of having controversial issues presented fairly and without bias.

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- 14. Instill respect toward our country and people.
- 15. Carry out, in good faith, all the duties of his or her office as a Board member to the best of his or her ability.

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
