EDUCATION FOR EMPLOYMENT

The Board shall provide an education for employment program for K-12 grade students.

All students shall have access to an education for employment program, which provides for the following:

- 1. Practical application of basic skills in the general and vocational curricula;
- 2. Community field experiences and, in grades seven through 12, school-supervised work experience,
- 3. Career exploration and planning which also addresses sex-role stereotyping in career decision-making,
- 4. Employability skills and attitudes;
- 5. Study of the practical application of economics and American economic institutions; and
- 6. In grades nine through 12, vocational education programs, which have an appropriate curriculum based on labor market information including follow-up studies of graduates, job placement and employment needs.

The school-to-work coordinator shall coordinate the education for employment program in accordance with state laws and regulations. Education for employment program records shall be maintained and reports shall be made as required by the Department of Public Instruction (DPI).
