STUDENT TRANSPORTATION GUIDELINES

- 1. An "unusual hazard" exists for students who are required to walk to school on a town road or county, state or federal highway where there are no sidewalks and the speed limit is in excess of 25 miles per hour.
- 2. Exceptional educational needs (EEN) students shall be transported on regular buses if they are able to get on and off the bus with little or no assistance and do not require special care while on the bus. The district shall provide the necessary transportation for EEN students who cannot ride the regular school bus per their I.E.P.
- 3. When it becomes necessary to transfer students out of the school they regularly attend the district will provided transportation to, those students who would normally walk to school.
- 4. In order for a temporarily impaired student to receive transportation, a letter from a physician stating the reasons necessary for special transportation must be on file in the transportation office prior to transportation being provided. This letter must be renewed yearly if continued transportation is to be provided.
