In 1938 a play entitled "*Our Town*," written by native Wisconsinite Thornton Wilder, appeared on a Broadway stage for the first time. Wilder's principal message—that people should appreciate the details and interactions of everyday life while they live them—rings as true today as it did in 1938. I was reminded of Wilder's famous play during a recent tour of town board meetings within our school district.

My tour of "our town" kicked off with a discussion about an electronic sign and a vacant lot in the Town of Hamilton. The purchase of a new truck, paying poll workers, and questions about technology highlighted my trip to the Town of Bangor. Hot topics in the Village of West Salem included new street lights and a change in equalized evaluation. The more urban Town of Shelby discussed police reports, dog licenses and recycling while snow plows, road repair, elections and questions about enrollment trends marked the visits to the Towns of Barre, Greenfield and Washington.

Attendance at town or village board meetings – our most basic form of government - offer citizens the opportunity to "appreciate the details and interactions" of local government. Town and village board members are a unique mix of both everyday and extraordinary. They are everyday people completing the everyday business of municipal government with extraordinary commitment and stewardship. I left each one of the board meetings with a sincere appreciation for these dedicated citizens who so willingly give of themselves to ensure for the safety and well-being of their neighbors.

The beginning of a new year affords each one of us the opportunity to commit ourselves to lives of abundance and gratitude - to savor the "details and interactions of everyday life" while we are living them. As a rather turbulent 2012 comes to an end, let us look forward to a 2013 filled with appreciation: appreciation for the gift of living in "Our Town - West Salem" where everyday is extraordinary.

Happy New Year! Have you made a New Year's resolution to get healthy and lose weight? If so, then you are amongst millions of other Americans! The difference between you and them is this year you're going to keep that promise. Here are some helpful tips to keep you focused and motivated:

Set SMART goals.

PECIFIC: A specific goal has a much greater chance of being accomplished than a general one. A general goal, for example, would be "Get in shape". But a specific goal would be to say "I'm going to join the West Salem Community Fitness Center and work out 3 days a week".

EASURABLE: Establish criteria for measuring progress toward the attainment of each goal you set. When you measure your progress, you stay on track, reach your target dates, and experience the exhilaration of achievment that spurs you on to continued effort required to reach your goal.

TTAINABLE: When you identify goals that are most important to you, you begin to figure out ways you can make them come true. You can attain almost any goal you set when you plan your steps wisely and establish a time frame that allows you to carry out those steps.

EALISTIC: To be realistic, a goal must represent an objective toward which you are both willing and able to work. A goal can be both high and realistic; you are the only one who decides just how high your goal should be. Just be sure that every goal represents substantial progress.

IMELY: A goal should be grounded by a time frame. With no time frame tied to it, there's no sense of urgency. For example, if you want to lose 10 pounds, when do you want to lose it by? "Someday" won't work. But if you anchor it within a set timeframe, "by May 1st", you've set your unconscious mind into motion to begin working on the goal.

Do exercises you enjoy. If you like watching TV in the evening, come in to the Fitness Center and watch your favorite TV show or football game while walking on the treadmill. You can also use commercials as a chance to do planks or sit ups. Or, if Bucky does push ups, so do you. Have fun with it!

Stick to what works for YOU! If you have been able to keep a fitness goal in the past by taking fitness classes or teaming up with a friend, then keep doing it. Come try out yogalates! The indoor walking track is also a great tool to utilize during the cold and snowy weather.

Open Enrollment

Who may participate in open enrollment?

- •Students in 5-year-old kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment.
- •Open enrollment for prekindergarten, 4-year-old kindergarten and early childhood education is limited. Parents should call their resident school districts to find out if their preschool-aged children qualify for open enrollment.

How and when may parents apply?

The open enrollment application period for the 2013-14 school year is from February 4-April 30, 2013. The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2013. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.

Parents may apply in one of two ways:

- •On-line (recommended) at http://sms.dpi.wi.gov/sms_psctoc.
- •Although on-line application is recommended, paper applications may be obtained from the Department of Public Instruction and must be delivered (hand-delivery is recommended) to the nonresident school district.

FAQ: Can an open enrolled student participate in sports and other extra –curricular activities in the non-resident school district?

- •Open enrolled students have the same rights and responsibilities as resident students.
- •Inter-scholastic athletics are governed by the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA), which has recently adopted new rules concerning transfer students. Parents should check with the school district's athletic director about eligibility.

Important open enrollment dates

February 4-April 30, 2013 – Parents must submit applications online or directly to the nonresident school district.

June 7, 2013 – Nonresident school districts must mail notices of approval or denial. If the application is approved, the school district must notify the parents of the specific school or program to which the student is assigned. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal.

June 14, 2013 – Resident districts must notify applicants if the application is denied. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal.

June 28, 2013 – Parents of accepted applicants must notify the nonresident district if the student will attend the nonresident district in the 2013-14 school year. If the parent fails to make this notification, the nonresident district may refuse to allow the student to attend the district.


