



I am sharing this space with guest columnist High School Principal Mark Carlson. He wrote this article for the high school December newsletter based on his memories of a Sports Illustrated article. As I read it, I thought that this story could be used for almost anyone who "makes a mistake." I also thought of those who are silently accused of errors and not actually confronted or given an opportunity to defend themselves. Often this happens when people make anonymous complaints and or conduct whispering campaigns against "good men". It's my belated Christmas gift to you.

"A man made a mistake. He was a good man...a regular guy. He had a good job, a nice family, and was well respected by the people that knew him. You could say, by most standards, he had it all. As many people do, he had decided to follow his father into the same profession. His father was a local legend, and try as he might this man could never quite live up to the standards his father had set. Oh, he was good at what he did ... one of the best, but there was one thing his father had attained that this man had not yet been able to reach. Then one day, after years of work and dedication, he finally made it. But just as he was about to attain that life-long goal that he believed would be the culmination of all his work and dedication, he made a mistake and it all came crashing down around him.

This mistake caused his family to be harassed. He received death threats. He was sent letters telling him how his mistake had ruined lives. He was told that he was no good and was a disgrace. He understood that a certain amount of criticism came with the job, but he had never experienced anything like this. Then, on top of everything else, the prize that he had earned...the thing that would link him with his father as one of the elite, was taken from him. At the depths of his depression, he found himself with a handful of pills thinking that if he ended it all right then, all the suffering and disgrace he had put his family through would also come to an end.

This man was a high school football official. He made a bad call during a game that cost a team a trip to the playoffs. As a result his family was harassed, he received death threats and the prize that would link him with is father as one of the elite ... an invitation for his crew to officiate in the state championships, was rescinded.

A major part of what sports in schools is all about is learning lessons. These are to be lessons that help shape a young person's character. These are lessons that are to help develop an athlete's ability to overcome adversity and to work towards a goal through team work and dedication. Whining, complaining, taunting, and arguing are not the type of things that are to typify what athletics is all about. But it is hard for our kids to learn these valuable life lessons when there are adults in the stands that "ride" the officials. make comments about every call that goes against their team. At a recent 8th grade boys' basketball game I heard a parent yell at a ref...calling him "baldy"!

Sometimes, I think, we forget that the officials are human beings. We forget that these men and women have wives, husbands, sons and daughters. We forget that they work all day at a regular job, and officiate in what amounts to be their free time. We forget the sacrifices they make to be away from their own families so that we can hold a game. High school officials do what they do for the love of the game...they don't get rich and they don't get famous. We forget that there are young children in the stands who hear everything we say...what type of lessons are they learning? We may not realize that the spouse and children of officials often come to the games. I often wonder how the people who "express their opinions aggressively" to the refs during games would like their spouse and kids to be present when a customer or employer criticizes them or their performance.

WSHS has received the state sportsmanship award three times this decade. That, in itself, is a major accomplishment and something we should all be proud of. Our school motto is that we are a 1<sup>st</sup> Class School. On our high school letterhead we showcase the principles of "respect, integrity, dedication and excellence". If we expect our kids to display those ideas while competing, we need to make sure we do the same from the stands.

Whatever happened to the man in the story? Last I knew he was doing okay. He is back to doing most of the things he enjoyed doing before the mistake. I'm not sure if he is still officiating, though."

You may apply for open enrollment from February 1-19, 2010, on-line at https://www2.dpi.state.wi.us/OpenEnrollApp

#### Who may participate in open enrollment?

Students in 4-year-old kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment.

In order for a 4-year old child to participate the resident district must also have a 4K program.

#### How and when may parents apply?

The open enrollment application period for the 2010-11 school year is from February 1-19, 2010. *Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.* 

Parents may apply in one of two ways:

- On-line (recommended) at https://www2.dpi.state.wi.us/OpenEnrollApp
- Although on-line application is recommended, paper applications may be obtained from the Department of Public Instruction or any school district after January 4, 2010, and must be delivered (hand-delivery is recommended) to the nonresident school district during the application period.

FAQ: Can an open enrolled student participate in sports and other extra-curricular activities in the nonresident school district?

Open enrolled students have the same rights and responsibilities as resident students.

Inter-scholastic athletics are governed by the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA), which has recently adopted new rules concerning transfer students. Parents should check with the WIAA or the school district's athletic director about eligibility.

Teachers Gwen Treu and Kari Schultz are organizing two new clubs, Reading club and gaming club, but they're not alone; they're assisted by student teacher Steve Arnold.

The whole purpose of these clubs is to expand opportunities from community. Parents may help by donating games or serving as a chaperone. They can share knowledge and teach others ways to play games.

#### Middle School Job Shadow Day

Wondering and imagining what your future job could ever be is stressful. From the qualification for the job to your amount of commitment, you can never be sure. That is why the West Salem School Middle School has given the 8th grade students an opportunity to help and learn in a position or job that they are most likely to want to pursue in their education. The program is called Job Shadowing. So, on November 12, the school sent out over 100 kids to shadow a career. Kids have job shadowed doctors, mechanics, florists, teachers, and more.

"It is very important that the person pursuing a career in education knows that it is the right fit for her/him. You need to have patience and be understanding. You need to love children and accept individual differences in children. You need to want to be a life-long learner. A job shadow experience will give you the opportunity to see first what the career entails" says Mrs. Antony, a kindergarten teacher at West Salem Elementary for around ten years. Antony had her own job shadow this year, Emma Schwartz, an 8th grader. "I think it is really cool that we get to do this, I was excited for today and am looking forward to a fun day," said Schwartz.

The commotion of a kindergarten class can only be understood when the person is in the situation. Teaching twenty, three foottall children is your responsibility. The class day starts with children huddled together in a cluster on the floor taking part in daily story time. They stare into the picture trying to come up with the words. Emma takes a turn in a storybook for a few small girls. "I love working with young children", says Schwartz. "They are a lot of work, but their energy can just rub off on you eventually." Actually, Emma's mom is a second grade teacher in West Salem. "I know a lot about a classroom and the structure that comes with it, because of my mom."

"It is a very positive school climate and I love the community also." says Antony, who graduated from UWL with a double major in Education and Early Childhood. The class did the basics of any kindergarten-read, sang, and danced, and had story time. Emma watched from the side as Ms. Antony led the class in song to learn the letters of the alphabet. As the kids joined in, the room instantly becomes a lively place to be.

Although teaching has its ups and downs, Emma says she will be ready to take it on one day. Antony spoke highly of Schwartz's experience at the elementary school. "Emma was a great help. I enjoy an extra set of hands in the classroom."

The experience only lasted until noon and was just a little glimpse of a day in the life of the person being shadowed, but

it was enough to either make one keep looking or hold this job idea in his/her head a little longer. Whatever the outcome in the job shadow is, West Salem Schools will keep this yearly event going.

Christian has been exploring abstract painting for a little over two years. His work in multimedia painting has consistently matured and improved. Christian's process involves applying and dripping various paints (acrylic, oil, latex) with a brush, and then taking that paint away by running water over it or scraping it.
