These seven individuals have, to the best of my calculations, a total of 128 years of service to the students of the West Salem School District and many more in other school districts. Each wrote in his or her retirement letter about the difficulty in leaving the students and staffs of their schools. They also were thankful to you, the citizens of West Salem, for the opportunity to serve the students in this district. They each have worked long hours in their attempt to have each child that they worked with as successful as possible. Mary originally was certified following her graduation from the University of Minnesota in art education. After obtaining her master’s degree in Special Education from UWL, she worked in the West Salem Middle School. Mary will be missed by the middle school students and staff as she has a special way with young adolescents.

Rosemarie (AKA-Tootie) Knutson is a favorite at the high school with the students. Her mother was Vivian Christianson, who worked in the district for many years in the food service department. Tootie has been an instructional paraprofessional for 20 years in the high school special education program. Good luck Tootie. She is a very special daughter.

Having served many other districts in the Coulee Region Joan Konze joined the West Salem staff in 1994 following her work through CESA in area school districts as a Speech and Language Clinician. She received her BA from Mankato State. Joan retired in December and we hope that she has enjoyed the first months of her retirement.

David Langer has held many interesting positions over his working career. He has been a carpenter and counselor in a group home. He graduated from Winona State University and received his Masters in Reading from UWL. He has served as the VP for the Midwest Reading Council and been a leader in our multi-age and school garden programs. David’s expertise in gardening will provide him with a position next year with our new Farm to School grant. Serving 22 years in West Salem as a lower elementary teacher has been a blessing to our district and staff.

Fifth grade was her specialty, but over her 23 year of service Marsha O’Neil served in several other grades. Both of her educational degrees were earned at UWL. Marsha will be sadly missed by her colleagues and parents of younger students who dreamed of having her teach their child. We know Marsha will enjoy every minute of retirement and keep very busy with her many hobbies and interests.

Please congratulate these individuals on their dedication to our community’s children. We know that these individuals have plans for new adventures. Each has made many positive differences in individuals’ lives and will be missed and in our thoughts and prayers.


Are you Transferring to a Different College or Do You Need a Copy of Your High School Transcript?

If you are a WSHS graduate and need a copy of your high school transcript please follow one of the following steps:

- 1) Send a letter/note to the high school student services office that includes:
 - a) full name as it appears on high school transcript
 - b) birth date
 - c) graduation year
 - d) address of where to send the transcript
 - e) graduate's signature (required)
 - f) \$2.00 fee per copy
- 2) Stop in during office hours to complete and sign a transcript request form and pay fee. Requests via phone or e-mail will not be honored. The graduate's signature is required on all requests for transcript.

Current year graduates do not pay to have their transcripts sent to their college of choice.

FYI - The high school does not keep a copy of your high school diploma.

The West Salem School District is conducting a summer school program for pre-kindergarten through eleventh grade students who reside within the school boundaries. Summer school has terms and sessions. The majority of the classes will be held at the elementary and middle schools. Sessions are the times of classes. Session 1 is 9:00 – 10:20 and Session 2 is 10:40 – 12:00.

Term 1 June 7 – June 18

Term 2 June 21 – July 2

Term 3 July 5 – July 16 (swimming only and no busses)

Term 4 August 9 – August 12 & August 16 – August 19 (Academic Literacy, Developmental Reading and Jump Start to 1st Grade classes only and teacher referral is required)

****No changes will be made to the Summer School schedules after Friday, May 28.****

****If you registered for Summer School and later find that your student will be unable to attend Summer School for any reason, please call the Middle School office as soon as possible, as we have waiting lists.****

****Skippers (for 4 & 5 year olds/Pre-5K) swim classes will be July 19 – July 23. Registration for Skippers is done thru the pool on or after June 9.**

Route two – Betty Hanson (bus 8) 8:00 A.M. - to CTH “B”, west on “B” to Wolf Ridge Court turn-around -- East on “B” past Maple Grove to “M” -- North on “M” to Hwy 16 to, west on Crestwood Avenue to Greenfield Lane, North on Greenfield and pick up students on corner of Waterloo Avenue, east to “M”, north on “M” to Hwy 16, west on Hwy 16 to Lusk Addition (go into addition and turn around), Nathan Hill/Moos Road -- North on Moos Road to Gills Coulee Road, east on Gills Coulee Road to “M” -- North on “M” to top of Holmen hill (to top if riders), back south on “M” and in to school.

Route three – Kathy Ganyo (bus 7) 8:00 A.M. -, “M” to CTH “C” east on “C” to Buol Road - go under the interstate -- West on “B” past Coulee Region RV Center, through town to Hwy 16 -- East on Hwy 16 to Old 16, west on Old 16 to “C” (108) -- North on “C” to Brickl turn-around, back south on “C” to Walker Road -- West on Walker Road to 108 -- North on 108 to Scotch Coulee, back south on 108 to Hwy 16 -- West on Hwy 16 and in to school. (This route will be picking up in Salem Territory, Waterloo Heights and Waterloo Avenue 2nd and fourth terms)

Route four – Kathy Morgan (bus 17) Students on this route will be picked up between 8:30 and 8:45. (1st Term only, 2nd and 4th Terms will be picked up by route three)

La Crosse Area Wrestlers (LAW)

Seven West Salem youth wrestlers competed in the State Championships in Madison, March 26-27. The seven young wrestlers from West Salem, Walker Polhamus, Cain Kammel, Cole Kammel, Noah Reedy, Nick Buisman, Aaron Bahr, and Devin Bahr, were among 32 members of the La Crosse Area Wrestlers Club (LAW) who qualified for the state competition by finishing first or second at regionals.

The West Salem contingent was led by Devin Bahr, who won a championship title in his age/weight bracket, and Noah Reedy, who placed third in his bracket. 17 of the 32 LAW competitors placed sixth or better at the event.

La Crosse Area Wrestlers has established a strong reputation in the area as a club for young athletes interested in learning the fundamentals of wrestling. Currently the club has 72 members, Pre-K through 8th grade. Head coach and part owner John Burns loves to help the kids. "The biggest thing they learn is confidence and self-value," said Burns.

The staff includes volunteer coaches that treat the youngsters like they were their own. Wrestlers cannot start competing until first or second grade, depending on the year born. "As long as you wrestled as hard as you could, you did great," Burns explains of the LAW philosophy of competition.

The program offers its athletes the best support they can get without a lot of pressure. "I like it here; whenever we mess up, they just tell us to do better next time and we will get them," said fourteen-year-old Jordan Corcoran.

The club is currently housed in a shed on the Bahr family land in the Town of Greenfield. The wrestlers practice 2-3 times a week, from 6:00 to 8:00.




