Steady As She Goes

This represents the last of many attempts at authoring an article for the monthly newsletter. My initial drafts offered information about open-enrollment and virtual schools. As I edited each draft, I became more and more uncomfortable with the feeling that I was avoiding a discussion about the ever-growing unrest in Madison

Coincidently, I received an e-mail from WASDA (The Wisconsin Association of School District Administrators) providing an update on the state budget process and the potential for dramatic budget reductions. The e-mail concluded with the following words of advice from WASDA Executive Director, Miles Turner:

"Your school board, teachers and community will be looking to you to be the calm, rational face of reason. You need to provide a sense of vision for your district. You need to indicate that these may be extremely difficult times but you need to work together for the best interest of Wisconsin's students."

With this as my motivation, here goes....

The political battle lines appear to have been drawn around Governor Walker's proposed solutions to the state's budget deficit. The proposals have exposed the economic, social and political differences of our citizenry. It seems as though the longer the conflict prevails, the more polarized we become. Attempting to balance a budget that includes a significant deficit requires difficult choices and enlists strong emotions. Our leaders in Madison are faced with a difficult task.

Speaking in general terms, the Governor has proposed a series of bold initiatives designed to balance the state's budget. Among the many proposals are a number that directly impact public education. Those garnering the most attention center on the rights of public

employees to collectively bargain a contract, employee payments into the state pension fund, and the cost of health insurance. Also, we are told the impending budget bill will provide for dramatic reductions in state equalization aid to schools along with revenue limit reductions to prevent property tax increases.

While still too early to offer specifics, the financial impact of the proposed changes will reduce our local school budget by shifting a portion of our current employee benefit costs from the school district to our employees. The cost savings are proposed to be paired with a reduction in our state equalization aid. Of concern is the indication that the proposed reductions in equalization aid will far exceed the savings gained from shifting employee benefit costs. The resulting deficit will require additional reductions in our programming. Also of concern is how the unknown parameters of the proposed changes in collective bargaining will affect the employee/employer relationship. As I stated earlier, eliminating our state's budget deficit will be difficult work

I suspect the political unrest and charged emotions will be prevalent for some time. I will make it my charge, and hope you will as well, to help our children to understand and appreciate the complexity of our democracy. Our school district will face many obstacles during this process. It is my hope that we find it in our hearts to serve as good role models for our children by handling our difficulties and differences thoughtfully and respectfully. Our children and our school district deserve nothing less.

Let me conclude by thanking the many of you who contacted me to share your thoughts and concerns. I appreciate the diversity of opinions. I especially want to thank our parents for their patience during these trying times. I assure everyone that your school board and I will do our very best to provide the leadership and vision necessary to best serve our children in the trying times ahead.

June 10, 2011 – Parents of accepted applicants must notify the nonresident district if the student will attend the nonresident district in the 2011-12 school year. If the parent fails to make this notification, the nonresident district may refuse to allow the student to attend the district.

Music Programs Gearing Up for Solo/Ensemble

West Salem High School will host this year's district Solo and Ensemble competition on Saturday, March 26th. The daylong event showcases vocal and instrumental performances and exposes music students to the assessment of qualified judges. To participate, performers must select their pieces from approved and rated song books. The musical selections are graded by their degree of difficulty, Class A being the hardest, Class B being moderately difficult, and Class C being the least difficult selections. There are over 5,000 songs to choose from.

During vocal performances, judges grade on all aspects of singing; posture, tone, diction, breathing, and volume. Instrumental performances are evaluated on tone, intonation, accuracy, technique and expression. The judges also provide constructive feedback for the young musicians. Outstanding soloists (or starred first performances) advance to compete at a state level.

"This is an amazing opportunity for young musicians who are trying to enhance their technique," said choir director Amy Hanson.

Mr. Kies agrees with Hanson but adds "Students are put in groups of anywhere from 2-10. In doing so they are made to be more accountable to their part as they are now more likely to be the only person playing that particular part. It's a messy process sometimes, but as a wise veteran teacher once told me, 'Dave, sometimes learning is messy' and the benefits are worth it, as we see students make some of their biggest strides (musically as well as leadership) during solo/ensemble time."
