Recently I discussed the big changes ahead in technology and the process of strategic planning for the future along with past lessons learned regarding budgets, annual meetings, and property taxes. Our elementary school is using a "paws-itive" approach to behavioral awareness by recognizing the many good things that happen every day. This program is part of a school-wide behavior intervention program used to better coordinate our approach to behavioral development.

Michelle Kloser, our School Nutritionist, is making her second trip to Washington DC this year. The first was her appearance at a White House reception for nationally recognized food service programs. The second trip will be to serve on a panel for the Kid's Safe and Healthful Food Project. It appears our food service programming is an example for the nation to follow!

As you may or may not know, Lisa Hugo, our elementary librarian, is on leave from her position as a result of her battle with a serious illness. In response, our elementary school hallways are adorned with a spectacular array of "Hearts for Hugo." The students have taken a few extra minutes to share kind words and thoughts for Mrs. Hugo. It is heartwarming to know our staff and students are part of such a caring and compassionate community.

Our drama department branched out with a new and innovative production of "Clue." The audience experience included a meal and actual participation in the play. The entire event, including the meal, was held on the Heider Center stage amidst the set of the play.

It seems as though we are bringing our new mission statement to life. We Serve with Passion by taking care of each other and by reaching each one of our students. We Ignite Creativity and Innovation with drama productions, wellness days, intervention schedules and "paws-itive" attitudes. We demonstrate **Excellence** by our gains in student achievement, our national merit finalist and as a national leader in school nutrition. Important open enrollment dates

February 6-April 30, 2012 – Parents must submit applications online or directly to the nonresident school district.

June 8, 2012 – Nonresident school districts must mail notices of approval or denial. If the application is approved, the school district must notify the parents of the specific school or program to which the student is assigned. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal.

June 15, 2012 – Resident districts must notify applicants if the application is denied. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal.

June 29, 2012 – Parents of accepted applicants must notify the nonresident district if the student will attend the nonresident district in the 2012-13 school year. If the parent fails to make this notification, the nonresident district may refuse to allow the student to attend the district.


7th Annual Mayfair Arts Festival


