April 1, Election Day 2014

The upcoming spring election offers the opportunity for a great deal of public decision-making on school district issues. The ballot will contain the annual school board election along with two referendum questions regarding construction projects.

This year there are two school board seats up for election to serve three-year terms. The two seats up for election are those held by Tom Ward and Syl Clements. Three candidates will appear on the ballot. Syl Clements is seeking re-election. Ralph Thorn and Catherine Griffin are each seeking their first term on the school board. Tom Ward is not seeking re-election. Voters will be allowed to cast a vote for two people.

The ballot will also include two referendum questions. The first question seeks permission to borrow \$32 million for the construction of a new intermediate/ middle school to serve students in grades 4-8. The second question seeks non-recurring or "one-time" permission for the school district to exceed the state-imposed revenue cap by up to \$500,000 for the purpose of providing security upgrades to the elementary school. The two official ballot questions can be viewed on page 3 of this newsletter.

Briefly, approval of the first question will allow the school board to borrow money for the purchase of constructing a new school building just to the north of the current district soccer complex. The new building will contain 160,000 square feet of educational space designed to provide a dynamic 21st century learning experience. The building will serve children in grades 4 through 8 allowing our elementary school to serve grades 4k through 3 and allowing for the repurposing of our current middle school.

The second question will afford the school board "one-time" permission to levy up to \$500,000 over the state imposed revenue limit for the purpose of security upgrades at the elementary school. The project

will include the construction of a new front entry to the elementary school along with upgrades to the exterior doors and security camera system. In regards to property taxes, approval of this question will not raise taxes as the amount will simply replace the final "mortgage" payment on the elementary school.

As stated earlier, the

results of the election on April 1st affords each one of us the opportunity to participate in the decision-making process. Please do your part to become informed of the issues and take the time to cast your vote.

Serve with Passion... Vote April 1, 2014

Please note the following round of new questions and answers discussed since the February newsletter.

ARE THERE ANY UPDATES REGARDING WHAT WILL HAPPEN TO THE CURRENT MIDDLE SCHOOL IF THE REFERENDUM PASSES? Yes, the Boys' and Girls' Club will publicly offer a "letter of intent" to pursue development in the current middle school. The school district continues to work with the West Salem Hockey Association and with other interested organizations.

What happened with the district enrollment studies? The school district contracted with the Applied Population Laboratory in Madison to provide a number of enrollment prediction studies. The most recent of these was completed in February of 2014 and can be viewed on our website. Unlike the two previous reports which indicated continued growth across our district, this most recent report predicts

a more stable population. While it appears the crowding in our elementary school will persist, this most recent report suggests it will not worsen as fast as previously thought. As with all such reports, the cautionary "wild cards" are housing starts, migration trends and open-enrollment numbers.

IF THE REFERENDA PASS, WHAT ARE THE TIMELINES FOR THE PROJECTS? With voter approval on April 1st, our architect firm will begin the 6-8 month process of creating a final design for the building with construction expected to begin in the spring of 2015. The anticipated opening of the new school is September of 2016. The security upgrades to our elementary school will be completed in 2015.

What happens if the referenda fail. If voters reject the referenda, the district will gather information from the public as to the reasons for the failure, reassemble district planning committees, and chart a course for moving forward. In the short term nothing will be different. Over the long term, the district will eventually need to address the traffic problems along Mark Street and necessary updates to our middle school, along with space and security issues at our elementary school.

What happens if one referendum questions passes and the other fails? The school board will be bound by the outcome and will proceed as directed. For example, if question number one fails while question number two passes, the school board will stop the process of preparing to construct a new school building but move forward with the prescribed safety upgrades to our elementary school. It is important to remember the two projects are separate.

CAN YOU REPEAT THE FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS? The school district currently makes an annual long term debt payment of \$2 million per year. This payment roughly breaks down to \$1.3 million for our high school and \$.7 million for our elementary school. The final payment on the elementary school will be made in October of 2014 while the final payment for the high school is scheduled for 2021.

With this in mind, passage of question number 1 will raise the annual bond payment from the current \$2 million to \$2.7 million and therefore result in an approximate seventy-five cents per thousand increase in property taxes or \$225 on \$300,000 worth of property. Passage of the second question will

not have an immediate tax impact as the "one-time" additional \$500,000 of levy can be worked around the bond schedule.

Should the referenda fail, the school board will have the option of reducing the tax levy by the \$.7 million identified as final the elementary school payment or maintaining the current tax levy amount of \$2 million for the purpose of accelerating the debt payment on our high school and becoming debt free by 2019.

How are the referenda connected to the recent land purchase. The district has pursued the purchase of additional land from La Crosse County for many years. The fact the county has agreed to sell 25 acres at the same time as the current referenda is coincidental. That said, the recent land purchase allows the district to access the proposed new school building from the east and will therefore greatly improve traffic flow on and around our campus.

Why these projects at this time? In their attempts to address the space issues at our elementary school and the impending upgrades to our middle school the school board and long range facility planning groups considered a number of options. From smaller, more temporary fixes to larger long-term solutions. Each option came with both positive and negative attributes. In the final analysis the community provided our school board with a clear thought, "if we are going to do something, then do it right and do it once."

The school board responded by offering a concept that addresses current and future space needs, improves upon traffic congestion, and provides a 21st century learning facility for grades 4 through 8 without re-investing in the current middle school. A critical factor in the board's decision to offer up a larger long-term solution is near-record low interest rates and ever-increasing construction costs will result in future projects either costing more or providing less. This long-term solution also allows the school district to remain a three building district and therefore keep annual operational costs from escalating.

The safety and security project at our elementary school results from the building being constructed prior to the more recent concerns over school security. The current structure allows visitors to easily enter our facility and roam about without detection. It is simply time to construct a safer front entry and security system.

QUESTION NUMBER II

"Shall the School District of West Salem, La Crosse County, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$500,000 for the 2014-2015 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of security improvements at the Elementary School?"

Who may participate in open enrollment?

- •Students in 5-year-old kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment.
- •Open enrollment for prekindergarten, 4-year-old kindergarten and early childhood education is limited. Parents should call their resident school districts to find out if their preschool-aged children qualify for open enrollment.

How and when may parents apply?

The open enrollment application period for the 2014-15 school year is from February 3-April 30, 2014. The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2014. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.

Parents may apply in one of two ways:

- •Although on-line application is recommended, paper applications may be obtained from the Department of Public Instruction and must be delivered (hand-delivery is recommended) to the nonresident school district.

Important open enrollment dates

February 3 – April 30, 2014 – Parents must submit applications online or directly to the nonresident school district.

June 6, 2014 – Nonresident school districts must mail notices of approval or denial. If the application is approved, the school district must notify the parents of the specific school or program to which the student is assigned. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal.

June 13, 2014 – Resident districts must notify applicants if the application is denied. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal.

June 27, 2014 – Parents of accepted applicants must notify the nonresident district if the student will attend the nonresident district in the 2014-15 school year. If the parent fails to make this notification, the nonresident district may refuse to allow the student to attend the district.

West Salem Board of Education Policy 384
Animals on School Grounds

Animals are not allowed on school grounds. Exceptions include licensed service dogs for individuals with an appropriate disability and certified search dogs accompanied by law enforcement. Other exceptions may be granted for curricular reasons following approval of a written request to the building principal.

This policy does not preclude pet owners from walking their leashed animal on the public sidewalks bordering Mark Street, Hamlin Street and East Avenue. Owners must pick up and properly dispose of any and all animal waste left by such animal on District property and are subject to local laws and ordinances pertaining to animal control.
