Continuing on to page seven you will note both the high school Quiz Bowl team and members of the high school DECA team will compete at the national level after winning their respective state-level competitions. This is the second recent trip to nationals for both groups. Interestingly enough, our Quiz Bowl team features two National Merit Scholars! Page seven also contains a list of our state competitors at the VAC (Visual Arts Classic) and Skills Fair competitions. Of note, Taylor Varichak is the two-time defending state champion in Power Equipment Technology going for an unprecedented third straight title while Harley Lang is the defending state champion in Cabinet Making looking to repeat.

As was stated many times during the process of developing our unique mission statement, we are fully intent on fostering a next generation of thinkers who can create jobs rather than find jobs. We therefore increased our emphasis and our investment in the areas related to creative problem solving and innovation. Important open enrollment dates

June 6, 2014 – Nonresident school districts must mail notices of approval or denial. If the application is approved, the school district must notify the parents of the specific school or program to which the student is assigned. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal.

June 13, 2014 – Resident districts must notify applicants if the application is denied. If the application is denied, parents have 30 days to file an appeal. June 27, 2014 – Parents of accepted applicants must notify the nonresident district if the student will attend the nonresident district in the 2014-15 school year. If the parent fails to make this notification, the nonresident district may refuse to allow the student to attend the district.
