

OEC Update

Serve with Passion to Ignite Creativity, Innovation, and Excellence

How is the mission applied in a kindergarten classroom? Mrs. Antony, kindergarten teacher, shares examples of "Creativity".

"Creativity is ignited in many forms in a kindergarten classroom. It is during the first six weeks that we offer our children many opportunities to get acquainted and share individual qualities. We also provide daily opportunities for the children to play with one another, building that security in our safe environment. Some



children build towers and discover new ways to put the magnatiles together, eventually discovering that you can build a tower that is vertical as well as horizontal. Children may also choose to

express their creativity in the housekeeping area, using their imaginations and playing different roles with their classmates. The art area is always a place for the children to experiment and create with different materials. Many children make pictures for a family member or their teacher. They love the opportunity for academic choice; allowing them to choose how they want to create makes each child more involved in the process and the end product is something they are proud of."



The Wisconsin Environmental Education Board (WEEB) was created in 1989, becoming law in 1990. One of the Board's responsibilities is to award grants for the development, dissemination, and implementation of environmental education programs. The West Salem School District has been the recipient of 5 grants from WEEB in the past 15 years.

With monies from the current grant, the High School Alternative Energy class built a solar collector, the advanced construction class has begun remodeling the bunkhouse at the Outdoor Education Center (OEC), and a new, "rainy day," curriculum will be developed for use at the OEC in grades K - 7. The solar collector will be installed and used to heat the new addition to the lodge. The bunkhouse will be turned into two new classrooms. In case of inclement weather, students will have a safe, dry place to go to continue their lessons while at the OEC. The rainy day curriculum will include indoor activities that teach the same concepts as the outdoor activities.

These projects have given many high school students research opportunities and hands-on experience in construction and will allow all students to enjoy learning at the OEC.



"The neat thing about this project is that my students got to have a lot of input into the floor plan layout of the new building. We are also re-using a lot of the material, and my students are going to be thinking of ways to be creative with the old materials," said Technology **Education Teacher** Matt Huenink

Reminder - Youth Options

The Youth Options (YO) program allows high school juniors and seniors who have completed all coursework in a specific content area to enroll at an institution of higher education in Wisconsin. Courses may lead to credit that can be applied toward high school graduation as well as toward postsecondary programs. Courses are offered without cost to students. A student who intends to enroll in the University of Wisconsin La Crosse, Viterbo College, or Western Wisconsin Technical College in the Spring semester of 2012 must adhere to the following timeline:

- 1. Prior to October, arrange a conference with YO Coordinator, Cathy Tyink, to receive application forms and discuss appropriate course selection. Requests need to be specified for courses either different from any class or extensions (higher level) of classes the high school offers. Completed forms along with copies of your high school transcript, current high school schedule and printout of attendance record are due no later than 3:00 p.m. on October 1, 2011.
- 2. By November 15, 2011 you will be notified of the action taken by the Board of Education as to whether or not the course(s) you selected will be awarded high school credit and how much credit will be awarded.
- Upon Board approval, the YO Coordinator will assist with institution paperwork, registration and schedule adjustments.

If the school board denies either the desired courses or the number of credits to be awarded, a pupil may appeal the decision to the state superintendent of schools within 30 days after receipt of the school board's decision.

State Testing

The start of school brings the anticipation of the Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Examinations. The testing window for the 2011-2012 school year is October 24 - November 25. This is a state-mandated test for all students in grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 10. There are five components to the 4-8-10 grade test: Reading, Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Grades 3-5-6-7 will test Reading and Math.

These tests are only one indication of how our schools are performing. There are many factors involved in school performance and the West Salem School District is dedicated and committed to providing quality education for our students and community. Please contact any of the school counselors if you have questions regarding WKCE testing: Gayle Lassen and Jennifer Grimslid at the elementary school, Mike Lang at the middle school, and Lynne Brown and Cathy Tyink at the high shool; or Michael St. Pierre, Director of Instruction.

Attendance on testing days is extremely critical. If your child misses school, he or she will be required to make up the test at another time, and thus miss more school/ class time. Please discuss the importance of these tests with your child(ren).

Make a commitment to do your best! * Get a good night's sleep prior to the test * Set the alarm to ring a little early to avoid having to rush in the morning * Pick out clothing at night before going to bed to avoid wasting time before going to school * Eat a good breakfast and lunch, but don't overeat * Wear comfortable clothing-something you feel confident wearing * Try to clear your mind of all worries * Resolve any disagreements with family and friends * Avoid activities that may tend to create controversy or unpleasantness * THINK POSITIVELY ABOUT THE TEST! A POSITIVE ATTITUDE COUNTS AS DOUBLE * Recognize and accept anxious feelings * Do not become discouraged because of difficult test items * Listen and watch carefully while instructions are being given * If you don't understand the directions, ask questions IMMEDIATELY * Read directions quickly, but carefully * Work swiftly and accurately * Find the proper answer space on the answer sheet and mark it carefully * Make sure the answer sheet number is the same as the number of the test question * Complete all the easier items. Don't waste time on the difficult ones. Come back to them * Eliminate answers which you know are wrong, then check the remaining responses for key words * Narrow your choices down to two answers, but if you still can't decide make an educated guess * If you complete your test with time left, be sure to go back and check your work * Be sure to erase any dots or stray marks on your answer sheet * Read the questions first * Read all of the answers * Use your head * Pace yourself * RELAX * Give yourself positive and reassuring messages * Have confidence!

West Salem Winter Sports' Parent Meeting

The winter pre-season sports' meeting will be held on Monday, October 31, 2011 in the Heider Auditorium beginning at 7:00 p.m. This meeting is for those athletes interested in participating in boys' or girls' basketball, wrestling, gymnastics, boys' or girls' hockey, skiing/snowboarding, and winter dance, and their parents/guardians. The 7:00 – 8:00 general session is only for those parents and athletes who did not fulfill this obligation at the fall pre-season meeting. Because of the significance of understanding and signing-off on some district and WIAA policies, parents and athletes need to be in attendance for the entire meeting. Therefore, the auditorium doors will be closed at 7:00 PM SHARP, and anyone not present at that time will need to schedule a later appointment time to get this information. At 8:00 p.m. all athletes and parents, with the exception of hockey, are expected to attend the break-out session with the coach(es) of their respective sport. From 6:30 - 9:00, there will be stations set up in the lobby to check the necessary paperwork requirements of each new athlete. It is strongly advised to arrive well before the 7:00 PM starting time to have the necessary time to understand what paperwork needs to be completed. Grade Advancement Policy - 345.4

The philosophy of the West Salem School District is for all students to achieve optimal learning based on high expectations and considerations of their abilities and needs. This applies to grade advancement of 4th to 5th and 8th to 9th grades and Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Exam (WKCE) results. The Board recognizes that students have diverse capabilities and interests and individual patterns of growth and learning. Therefore, the Board believes it is important that teachers have as much accurate knowledge of each student as is possible through daily observations and student records.

Because the promotion of students from the fourth grade to the fifth grade and from the eighth to the ninth grade is affected by State Statues (ss.118.33)(6)(a), this grade advancement policy applies to such promotions. Other district policies relating to the promotion of students apply if they are not inconsistent with this policy. Beginning on September 1, 2002, no student may be promoted from the fourth grade to the fifth grade or from the eighth grade to the ninth grade unless the student satisfies the criteria for promotion in this policy.

Grade advancement decisions will be based on the three criteria listed below. For those students opted-out of the WKCE, judgment is based on the other specified criteria.

A-1. Student Score on Wisconsin Knowledge and Concepts Exam (WKCE)

Receives a score of basic or above on 3 or more of the 5 subtests that compromise the WKCE.

AND

A-2. By achieving a grade point average of 2.0 or above (on a 12 point scale) in graded subjects; or

By successfully completing the Goals and Objectives on the Individual Education Plan (IEP).

OR

B. Teacher Recommendations

The recommendation will be determined through consensus of the Grade Advancement Committee. The Grade Advancement Committee from the elementary and middle school shall consist of the following membership: building principal or assistant building principal, school counselor, classroom teachers of the student in question, Director of Pupil Services or designee. In addition, the building principal may include others in the formal teacher recommendation, if deemed appropriate. The Grade Advancement Committee, in its formal process, may evaluate the following:

- 1. The student's school development history.
- 2. Student achievement level and curricular expectations.
- 3. Alternative instructional strategies available and currently being implemented (remedial services, peer tutoring, etc.).
- 4. The extent of alternative programming available in both the new and repeated grade.
- 5. Age of the student.
- 6. The results of special education testing.

Parent (s) or guardian (s) will be invited to attend the meeting of the Grade Advancement Committee. However, the final decision rests with the West Salem Board of Education. The student may participate as deemed appropriate by parent (s) or guardian (s).

OR

B. Other Academic Criteria Specified by the School Board


Successful completion of an individual remediation plan designed by the Grade Advancement Committee.

The district administrator shall be responsible for the general supervision and management of the promotion of students under this policy. The district administrator or, if assigned the responsibility by the district administrator, the building principal shall determine whether a student has satisfied the criteria in this policy. This policy is designed to encourage early identification and interventions for those students who have academic, behavioral, and/or emotional difficulties. Written confirmation will be sent to the parent (s) or guardian (s) regarding the final decision by June 15 of the just completed school year. Decisions will apply for the following year.
