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West Salem Middle School Construction

The village of West Salem passed a referendum in 2016 for \$25 million. The referendum had two parts — one for a middle school and one for updates and construction of campus facilities.

The construction on the middle school started in mid June. The builders did as much as they could before school started, but they couldn't build a whole school in a summer.

When school started, the students and teachers were very flexible and willing to change their daily lives at school. Rachel Stein, an 8th grader says, "It's sad that we don't get to use the new building, and sometimes it's a nuisance in class but overall it'll be a good change." She and the rest of the 8th graders will only go to the new school for a couple months, if everything is on schedule. The teachers have also been dealing with some issues including too much noise, loud music, and moisture in the walls and ceiling. Mr. Wopat says he gives a lot of credit to the students and staff and wants to thank them for continuing to learn.

The first rooms completed will be the band, choir, and general music rooms. The rest of the school will be completed after. The 5th graders will be joining the middle school next year with their own pod. Each grade will have a pod of classrooms and the lockers will be in the pod also (there will be plenty of lockers for all students). The gym is bigger than the elementary school's gym, but smaller than the high school one.


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West Salem Middle School Construction continued

The main coach is Tyler Shrake, or as we call him, Shrake, Adam Kratochvill is also a coach. We call him Kratochvill.


