Letter from Superintendent Troy Gunderson

Thanks, Praise, and Progress

On November 8th, school district voters approved of two school district referenda questions requesting permission to borrow money in order to finance a series of repairs and improvements to our campus. On behalf of the entire school district community, I offer our appreciation to the more than 5,470 residents who voted in the election on November 8th. We offer our promise to work tirelessly to create the very best facilities for our kids and to ensure the very best value for our community. Thanks!

Speaking of value, the recently released state report card revealed the School District of West Salem to be the top performing school district in CESA#4. We were the only school district in CESA #4 to achieve the lofty status of "Significantly Exceeds Expectations." Further examination of the data reveals our district to be in the top 54 out of 431 school districts in Wisconsin with respect to academic performance. When combined with the Wisconsin Tax Payers Alliance report indicating our school district is the third lowest spending district in CESA #4 and in the bottom 45 out of 431 school districts in Wisconsin in per pupil expenditures, it appears our school district offers a great

value. More succinctly, top 12% in performance combined with bottom 10% in cost equals great value for students, parents, and taxpayers. Praise!

Your 2016 property tax bill will arrive from your municipality in December. Please look closely at the comparison between the 2015 net school tax and the 2016 net school tax. You should notice an approximate decrease of 7.5%. As noted in the recent referendum-related communication, the tax levy decrease is primarily the result of state-imposed revenue limits and our expanding tax base. Praise!

In other news, the project at our transportation facility is nearly finished. With final touches to be wrapped up by December 1st, this facility is set to serve our drivers and their buses just in time for another Wisconsin winter. Work continues on the swimming pool facility with general construction of the pool house currently underway. Grand opening is set for early June. Progress!

November of 2016 will be remembered as a milestone month for the School District of West Salem.

We reached consensus regarding our facility issues with two successful referenda questions, outperformed all other school districts in CESA #4 on the recently released state report card, sent out lower property tax bills than were issued the previous year, completed renovations to our transportation facility, and started work on the new pool house. Progress!

On behalf of the entire school district, I offer our appreciation and congratulations to the many wonderful employees who "Serve with Passion..." everyday in our school district. They are the heroes who get the job done. I also offer our gratitude to the residents of our school district for your generous support of public education. You are the supporters who make it happen. Thanks and Praise!



Convene

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Syl Clements. The meeting was noticed to the Coulee News, La Crosse Tribune, WLSU Radio 89 FM, WXOW TV-19, WKBT-TV, WKTY, WIZM, Union State Bank, First Community Credit Union, St. Joe's Country Market, River Bank-Barre Mills, West Salem Post Office, Village of West Salem, posted at each school, district web site, and district office on October 20, 2016.

Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag Tom Grosskopf led everyone in the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance and Ken Schlimgen recited the District Mission Statement.

Roll Call

Approval of Agenda

Mrs. Halverson moved, Mr. Schlimgen seconded to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Connection with the Community

Paige Dunnum reported on:

- 1. On Wednesday, October 19, the whole school district wore the color orange to support Unity Day. October is Bullying Prevention Month and Unity Day is a day for the community and schools to come together to unite against bullying and to teach students about the importance of compassion.
- 2. Last Thursday, the drama department put on a play entitled "The Night of the Living Dead". The performance was based off of the 1968 film in which seven people are trapped in an isolated farmhouse as a mysterious radiation transforms the undead into flesh eating zombies.
- 3. Also on Thursday, a debate took place in the Heider Center between Julian Bradley and Steve Doyle, candidates for the 94th Assembly District seat. Senior, Nick Schultz organized this event for his senior exit project.

Simon Buchanan reported on:

- 1. This past Friday the football team won their first playoff game over Nekoosa. The next playoff game will be this Friday, and they will play G-E-T.
- 2. The volleyball team is regional champions winning 3 games over Neillsville. Their sectional game will be at Merrill on Thursday.
- 3. The soccer lost their first playoff game last week at Dodgeville.

Board Grant Review Committee – Mrs. Kopnisky-Bloomfield reported that the committee met and reviewed ten applications and is recommending awarding seven for a total of \$9,146.15.

Reports by Scott Johnson, Davita Molling, Rick Kline, Kerri Feyen, and Troy Gunderson were reviewed.

Consent Agenda

Mr. Schlimgen moved, Mrs. Kopnisky-Bloomfield seconded to approve the Regular Board Meeting Minutes of October 10, 2016. Motion carried. (6-Aye, 0-Nay, 1-Abstain) Mrs. Griffin Abstained.

Mr. Schlimgen moved, Mrs. Griffin seconded to approve the invoices to be paid. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Schlimgen moved, Mrs. Kopnisky-Bloomfield seconded to approve the Open Enrollment requests for the 16-17 school year as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mrs. Halverson moved, Mrs. Kopnisky-Bloomfield seconded to approve the second semester Youth Options requests. Motion carried. (6-Aye, 0-Nay, 1-Abstain) Mrs. Griffin Abstained.

Discussion/Action Items:

Mrs. Halverson moved, Mr. Schlimgen seconded to accept multiple donations for the DECA Club in memory of Frances Koukol. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Schlimgen moved, Mr. Grosskopf seconded to adopt the following:

Resolution: Be It Resolved that the School District of West Salem will borrow on a short-term basis the sum of \$2,000,000 for the operation of the schools of the district: \$1,000,000 on October 27, 2016, with an additional \$1,000,000 on November 28, 2016, with a payment of \$1,000,000 to be made on December 7, 2016, and the final payment of \$1,000,000 on January 23, 2017. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Brickl moved, Mrs. Halverson seconded to approve the 2016-17 budget as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Mrs. Halverson moved, Mr. Brickl seconded to set the 2016-17 school tax levy at \$7,837,479 with a mill rate of \$9.42. Motion carried unanimously.

Little Learners Day Care has officially informed the School District of West Salem that they do not want to renew the agreement to provide four-year-old kindergarten beyond the 16-17 school year. No action was taken.
