Happy New Year from SDWS

Happy New Year! The arrival of a new year provides the customary opportunity to reflect upon the previous year while making resolutions for the next one.

Upon reflection, 2017 was a banner year for our school district highlighted by the designation of our elementary school as a National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence, all three of our school buildings reaching our strategic goal of exceeding expectations on their respective state report cards, and the beginning of the construction projects designed to update our campus. Our students and staff are achieving excellence in the classroom while our community reinvests in our facilities and programs. What a special time to be a Panther!

In addition to the many specific goals outlined in the district strategic plan, 2018 is anticipated to witness completion of our campus renovation, continued academic and co-curricular success, increasing enrollment, and expanding support for our school district and community. We resolve to appreciate our gifts, communicate our intentions, and celebrate our accomplishments. Stating specific goals and resolutions signifies hope and confidence that 2018 will be even better than 2017. We can do this!

Under the heading of "keeping you in the loop," here are a few general updates as we begin our work in 2018:

The school board will host a referendum on February 20th requesting permission to borrow an additional \$1.5 million for the outdoor projects, events center, and high school automotive program with the understanding the middle school project will be completed \$1.5 million under budget. The slate of candidates is set for the school board election on April 3, 2018. There are three seats up for election. Incumbents Jane Halverson and Ken Schlimgen along with first time candidate Robin Fitzgerald will appear on the ballot.

The construction project at our middle school is progressing right on schedule. Students and staff anticipate "moving" from the old part of the building to the new part of the building around the first of April. Work will then begin on renovations to the older part of the building in advance of project completion in time for the start of a new school year in the fall of 2018.

The budget and planning process for the 2018 – 2019 school year officially begins this month as the district completes a required student count and initiates discussions about scheduling and staffing. The process will be especially complicated this year as the plan to move 5th grade from the elementary school to the new middle school, combined with continued enrollment growth, will impact both staffing and programming.

Thank you for reading and thank you for your continued support of public education.

February Referendum

The school board has decided to return to the ballot box in 2018 to request permission to borrow an additional \$1,500,000 to complete renovations to the high school automotive lab and to complete the construction of the proposed athletic facilities. If you recall, in 2016, voters approved borrowing up to \$20 million for renovations and an addition to the middle school, and up to \$5 million for the athletic facilities, which included tennis courts, softball diamonds, track, football field, stadium additions, and multipurpose events center, for a total borrowing authority of \$25 million. The middle school project is under budget, resulting in the school board borrowing \$18.5 million of the \$20 million limit approved for the project. The proposed athletic facilities are expected to cost \$6 million, or \$1 million more than the \$5 million approved by voters in 2016, and the work on the automotive lab is projected to cost \$500,000, bringing the total back to \$25 million. In a sense, the board is requesting to use the remaining money from the middle school project to complete the athletic facilities and renovate the auto shop. The election will be held on February 20, 2018.

1. Why do another referendum now?

The answer to this involves two main points: the legal issue of binding elections, and timing. By asking two referendum questions in November of 2016, the board provided both transparency and self-imposed restrictions. The board can now only use referendum approved dollars in the manner described on the ballot approved by the voters last year. So, they cannot simply "transfer" funds from one project to another. They need permission to make a change.

Second is the issue of timing. The multi-purpose events center/ice arena will be let for bids in February 2018. The original budget for this portion of the athletic project was estimated at \$2.7 million and determined before the design was complete. The other projects connected to the second question were designed and bid with the middle school project, so they are on schedule and on budget. We now estimate the cost of the events center to be approximately \$3.7 million. If the referendum passes in February, we anticipate the events center will be completed in time to be used for gymnastics practice and ice hockey in the fall of 2018, and then as a concessions area for softball and soccer in the spring of 2019. If the referendum fails in February, the board will be required to decide which portions of the proposed events center will remain unfinished. So, timing is important.

2. What about my taxes?

The district planned to borrow the total \$25 million required to complete all projects as allowed by the 2016 referendum. The financing schedule currently in place is designed for this amount. Approval or rejection of this

referendum question will have little, if any, impact on property taxes other than lowering the final payment in 2037.


3. Why renovate the auto lab?

The board included budget dollars in our regular maintenance budget for minor upgrades to our high school auto lab. While developing a plan for gradual improvement, the board came to the conclusion that it would be preferable to make more substantial improvements to this facility all at once. As you may or may not know, the automotive lab was once the district bus garage, and then maintenance facility. The high school auto program moved into this facility 15 years ago when the maintenance crew moved to their new facility near the stadium. The automotive program is now running year around and serving kids from West Salem and surrounding school districts. It is time for an upgrade.

Mr. Schlimgen moved, Mr. Grosskopf seconded to approve the following resolution: Resolution Awarding the Sale of \$5,100,000 General Obligation Promissory Notes.

WHEREAS, on August 22, 2016, the School Board of the School District of West Salem, La Crosse County, Wisconsin (the "District") adopted an initial resolution ("Initial Resolution Number I") authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$20,000,000 for the purpose of paying the cost of a school improvement program consisting of: renovations and additions at the current Middle School; renovations and building infrastructure improvements at the Elementary School; site improvements, including additional parking and a new bus transfer area; and acquisition of related furnishings, fixtures and equipment (the "Initial Resolution Number I Project"); and an initial resolution ("Initial Resolution Number II" and collectively with Initial Resolution Number I, the "Initial Resolutions") authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$5,000,000 for the purpose of paying the cost of District athletic facilities improvements consisting of: replacing the track and constructing additional track/ football stadium seating, constructing and equipping baseball and softball fields, tennis courts, and a multi-purpose sports and events facility; and completing related site improvements (the "Initial Resolution Number II Project" and collectively with the Initial Resolution Number I Project, the "Project"), and there are insufficient funds on hand to pay said cost;

WHEREAS, on August 22, 2016, the School Board adopted a resolution providing for a referendum election on the proposition of whether Initial Resolution Number I and Initial Resolution Number II should be approved;

WHEREAS, a referendum election was held on November 8, 2016 in the District in which 3,352 votes were cast "YES" for approval and 2,118 votes were cast "NO" for rejection of Initial Resolution Number I and 3,242 votes were cast "YES" for approval and 2,209 votes were cast "NO" for rejection of Initial Resolution Number II;

WHEREAS, the Board of Canvassers duly reported the aforesaid results to the District Clerk who has made said results public;

WHEREAS, the provisions of Section 67.12(12)(e)(2), Wisconsin Statutes, provide that if the purpose and amount of a borrowing have been approved by the electors, general obligation promissory notes may be issued without any additional approval by the electors;

WHEREAS, the District issued \$9,900,000 General Obligation School Improvement Bonds, dated December 21, 2016 to pay a portion of the cost of the Initial Resolution Number I Project authorized by Initial Resolution Number I and the referendum election;

WHEREAS, the District issued \$10,000,000 General Obligation Corporate Purpose Bonds, dated April 6, 2017 to pay an additional \$4,000,000 portion of the cost of the Initial Resolution Number I Project authorized by Initial Resolution Number I and the referendum election, a \$4,500,000 portion of the cost of the Initial Resolution Number II Project authorized by Initial Resolution Number II and the referendum election and \$1,500,000 for a refunding;

WHEREAS, the School Board hereby finds and determines that the Project is within the District's power to undertake and therefore serves a "public purpose" as that term is defined in Section 67.04(1)(b), Wisconsin Statutes;

WHEREAS, the District is authorized by the provisions of Section 67.12(12), Wisconsin Statutes, to borrow money and issue general obligation promissory notes for such public purposes;

WHEREAS, the District has directed Robert W. Baird & Co. Incorporated ("Baird") to take the steps necessary to sell general obligation promissory notes (the "Notes") authorized by the Initial Resolutions and the referendum election to pay a \$4,600,000 portion of the cost of the Initial Resolution Number I Project and the remaining \$500,000 portion of the cost of the Initial Resolution Number II Project;

WHEREAS, Baird, in consultation with the officials of the District, prepared an Official Notice of Sale (a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by this reference) setting forth the details of and the bid requirements for the Notes and indicating that the Notes would be offered for public sale on November 27, 2017;

WHEREAS, the District Clerk (in consultation with Baird) caused a form of notice of the sale to be published and/or announced and caused the Official Notice of Sale to be distributed to potential bidders offering the Notes for public sale on November 27, 2017;

WHEREAS, the District has duly received bids for the Notes as described on the Bid Tabulation attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Bid Tabulation"); and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the bid proposal (the "Proposal") submitted by the financial institution listed first on the Bid Tabulation fully complies with the bid requirements set forth in the Official Notice of Sale and is deemed to be the most advantageous to the District. Baird has recommended that the District accept the Proposal. A copy of said Proposal submitted by such institution (the "Purchaser") is attached hereto as Exhibit C and incorporated herein by this reference.

Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Grosskopf moved, Mr. Schlimgen seconded to approve the following resolution: Initial Resolution Authorizing General Obligation Bonds in an Amount Not to Exceed \$1,500,000.

BE IT RESOLVED by the School Board of the School District of West Salem, La Crosse County, Wisconsin that there shall be issued pursuant to Chapter 67 of the Wisconsin Statutes, general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$1,500,000 for the public purpose of paying the cost of a school building and improvement program consisting of renovating, expanding and improving the high school automotive repair facility; continuing construction at the multi-purpose sports events center; and acquiring any related fixtures, furnishings and equipment.

Motion carried. 5-Aye, 1-Nay (Mrs. Griffin)

Mr. Schlimgen moved, Mr. Grosskopf seconded to approve the following resolution: Resolution Providing for a Referendum Election on the Question of the Approval of an Initial Resolution Authorizing the Issuance of General Obligation Bonds in an Amount Not to Exceed \$1,500,000.

WHEREAS, the School Board of the School District of West Salem, La Crosse County, Wisconsin (the "District"), has heretofore duly adopted a resolution entitled: "Initial Resolution Authorizing General Obligation Bonds in an Amount Not to Exceed \$1,500,000" (the "Initial Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, the School Board deems it to be desirable and in the best interest of the District to direct the District Clerk to submit the question approved in the Initial Resolution to the electors for approval or rejection at the regularly scheduled election to be held on February 20, 2018.
