During our recent school district strategic planning sessions, a number of participants from various groups expressed the need for a strong working relationship between the school district and local municipal government. In response, the school board hosted a meeting with various municipal board members, and representatives from La Crosse County. The purpose of the meeting was to seek common ground and understanding regarding future growth in our school district.

La Crosse County Administrator, Steve O'Malley and La Crosse County Planner, Charlie Handy discussed the potential development of county property located in the Village of West Salem, reported on construction progress at the new county health center located just east of Lakeview Health Center, and offered an update regarding other countywide development trends. Each municipal board offered a summary of current development within each municipality, along with predictions about the potential for future growth. The meeting concluded with a number of productive conversations and expressions of appreciation for the opportunity to meet.

The primary takeaway from the meeting is the generally accepted prediction of slow and steady population growth for both the county and our school district. Both regional demographic and economic data support this prediction. A second takeaway is the realization that changing social and demographic conditions arising from the retirement of the "baby-boom" generation combined with the emerging dominance of the "millennial" generation will change future development patterns. A third and final takeaway is the need to be more purposeful and collaborative in our approach to sustaining a healthy community and a healthy school district.

Moving forward, how can we all work together to chart a purposeful course for continued healthy and productive community growth?

First, what is our community vision? Will we begin to attract the millennial generation given their desire for services, social outlets, parks, and recreation? Will we continue to grow our business community with their need for quality infrastructure, markets, and an ample workforce?

Will we attract more of the baby boom generation as they enjoy retirement and "55 and better!" with options for downsizing, health care, and social activities? Will we strike the correct balance between taxes and services? Will it all happen on purpose or by accident?

Second, what are our strengths? As every realtor will tell you, "location, location, location!" We simply occupy the best location in our region. We have convenient access to both I-90 and the La Crosse/Onalaska metro area, combined with beautiful scenery, quiet neighborhoods, recreation galore, the lake, the river, the race track, and so on. We literally have it all!

What are our weaknesses? Like is so often the case when your strength is having multiple options, the flip side is having so many options that competing interests can make consensus difficult. A number of diverging comments offered during our various planning discussions illustrate this point. The opinions ranged from becoming an industrial center to a bedroom community, from restricting all expansion to promoting unfettered growth, and from creating a youth movement to becoming a retirement community.

What can you do? Next time you are out and about in your municipality, attempt to see it as a person or business considering a move. How are the roads and streets? What do the buildings look like? Do you see signs of progress, or decay? Talk with your neighbors. Contact your municipal representative. Attend a meeting. Offer your input and help. Be a citizen, do your part.

What can the school district do? We offer our support in working with our municipal partners in the planning process and offer our commitment to maintaining our standing as a community asset. We pledge to live our mission and "serve our community with passion" by providing the best possible education for our kids.

Managing the complex process of community growth is extraordinarily difficult. We thank the folks on our municipal boards for their service and encourage everyone to offer both assistance and support. The greater West Salem community is a wonderful place to live and work. We are blessed in so many ways. Making it even better for the next generation of citizens just takes a little cooperation. One for all and all for one!

2016-2017 Elementary Registration

4K Registration

sandwiches for 21 family members.

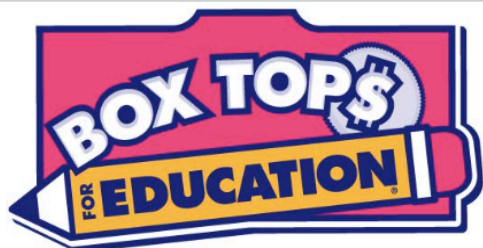

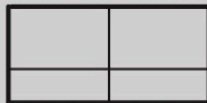

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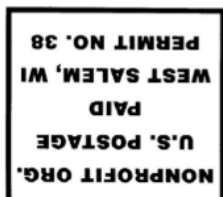
