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Letter from Superintendent Troy Gunderson

Developing the annual school district budget is a yearlong process that begins and ends with the Annual District Meeting each year in October. The months of March and April include vigorous debate about department budgets and staffing. As noted in recent newsletters, the spring of 2017 has been especially difficult. Amidst vigorous debate about class size, maintenance, health care, and general programming, the discussion turned towards the topic of property taxes and generated a number of questions. It seems like an appropriate time for a quick review:

How are school district property tax levels determined?

Local school district property tax levels are determined using a combination of voter-approved levies and stateimposed revenue limit calculations. The School District of West Salem levy rate for 2017 is \$9.42 per thousand dollars of property. This is down 7.6% from the previous three years when the levy rate held steady at \$10.20 each year.

What percentage of my total property tax bill goes to the school district?

Looking at a typical 2016 residential property tax bill for

the Village of West Salem reveals that only 46% of the total property tax collected is forwarded to the school district. The other 54% is shared amongst the Village of West Salem (20%), County of La Crosse (23%), Western Technical College (9%), Lake Neshonoc District (1%), and the State of Wisconsin (1%).

What is the outlook for 2018?

An examination of Governor Walker's 2017 – 2019 budget proposal, increasing property values, and additional local development suggests a 2018 school district tax levy rate of approximately \$8.75 per thousand dollars of property, or a decrease of somewhere around 7% when compared to 2017.

How can our property taxes go down when we passed \$26.5 million in bond referenda last year?

During the 15 years prior to 2017, the school district made a \$2 million per year "mortgage" payment for debt from the construction of our elementary school and the renovation of our high school. Following the successful referenda in 2016, the combination of the new

\$26.5 million debt for the various projects mixed with the remaining debt from the high school project, all financed at record low rates, creates a new annual "mortgage" payment of approximately \$2 million. Meanwhile, during this same 15-year period, the total property value of our school district has more than doubled. In conclusion, the school district is making approximately the same annual payment, the district is roughly twice as big, and therefore each person's share of taxes collected to make the annual payment is less.

The world of school district finances is changing. The School District of West Salem is becoming more property rich at a time when state funding formulas are in flux. Projections for the future suggest continued local budget deficits combined with decreasing property tax rates. Soon, the School District of West Salem will be forced to consider an operational referendum similar to those considered by neighboring school districts.



Connection with the Community

Paige Dunnum reported on:

1. The West Salem Music Department held their annual alumni band and choir concert in the Heider Center on March 18. This year's concert featured over 200 band and choir students and nearly 40 alumni and community members.

2. The West Salem Music Department also took over 40 senior band and choir members on a field trip to the Fireside dinner theatre this past Thursday. The seniors watched Fireside's production of Beauty and the Beast, which will also be performed by our own students in the Heider Center in June, as the show is the high school summer musical.

3.
