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Letter from Superintendent Troy Gunderson

Ready, Set, Graduate!

On Sunday, May 28, another class of eager graduates will cross the stage at West Salem High School joining those before them as official members of the "panther for life" club known as WSHS Alumni. Graduation from high school is special day for parents, students and community members as we celebrate the symbolic right of passage that signifies entrance into adulthood. Congratulations Class of 2017!

High school graduation also marks the completion of the educational programming we offer our students and therefore it's a perfect time to evaluate our performance. In hopes of better "quantifying" the quality of our programming, the school district strategic plan now includes reference to a nationally acclaimed document entitled "Redefining Ready." In short, the document provides a series of college and career "readiness" indicators easily adapted to local programming. The indicators are the result of several longitudinal studies connecting college and career performance with various

high school accomplishments and experiences. For more information, check out www.RedefiningReady.org.

The college readiness indicators are universal and apply to all forms of post-secondary education not just traditional "4-year colleges." The indicators include the expected connection to standardized tests and high school grades along with more unique indicators such as completion of courses earning college credit, performance in Algebra II, college academic advising, campus connections, and completion of the FAFSA or Free Application for Federal Student Aid.

The career readiness indicators begin with the required identification by the student of a career cluster matching the student's interest with his/her aptitudes and abilities. The remaining list of supplemental indicators includes attendance, community service, workplace learning experiences, industry credentials, career-related coursework, and co-curricular participation.



Emily Trautman





The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m. by Syl Clements. Approval of Agenda

Mrs. Halverson moved, Mrs. Kopnisky-Bloomfield seconded to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.

Organization of the 2016–2017 School Board Mr. Grosskopf moved, Mrs. Halverson seconded to nominate Syl Clements for the office of President. Mrs. Halverson moved, Mrs. Griffin seconded to close the nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Syl Clements as President of the West Salem School Board. Motion carried unanimously.

Mrs. Halverson moved, Mr. Schlimgen seconded to nominate Tom Grosskopf for the position of Vice President. Mrs. Kopnisky-Bloomfield moved to nominate Catherine Griffin for the position of Vice President. Mrs. Halverson moved, Mr. Grosskopf seconded to close nominations. Paper ballots were used. Mr. Grosskopf received three votes and Mrs. Griffin received three votes. Both Mr. Grosskopf and Mrs. Griffin agreed to use a coin toss to select the Vice President. Mr. Mallicoat performed the coin toss and Mr. Grosskopf won the coin toss and will serve as the Vice President of the West Salem School Board.

ANNUAL NOTICE

Homeless Children and Youth

The McKinney-Vento Acto defines homeless children and youth as:

- Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are:
 - sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason
 - Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations
 - Living in emergency or transitional shelters.
 - Abandoned in hospitals
 - Living in a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings
 - Living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
 - Migratory children who qualify as homeless because the children are living in circumstances described above

If you are personally aware of or are acquainted with any children or youth who may qualify according to the above criteria, the West Salem School District provides the following assurances to parents and guardians of homeless children and youth and accompanied homeless youth:

- The child or youth shall be immediately enrolled and allowed to fully participate in school, even if unable to produce records normally required for enrollment (e.g., academic records, immunization and other required health records, proof of residency, or other documentation) or has missed application or enrollment deadlines during any period of homelessness.
- Homeless children and youths are not stigmatized or segregated on the basis of their status as homeless and have full and equal educational and related opportunities.
- Meaningful opportunities to participate in the education of their children including special notices of events, parent-teacher conferences, newsletters, and access to student records.
- Immediate enrollment and transportation to the school of origin. "School of origin" means the school that a child or youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled, including a preschool.
- Written explanation of any decisions related to school selection or enrollment made by the school, the local educational agency, or the State educational agency involved, including the rights of the parent, guardian, or unaccompanied youth to appeal and receive prompt resolution of such decisions.
