

STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS

Student organizations have an important place in the educational program of the School District of West Salem because, when properly organized and operated, they:

1. Extend and reinforce the instructional program.
2. Give students practice in democratic self-government.
3. Build student morale and spirit for positive support for the school.
4. Honor student achievement.
5. Provide wholesome social and recreational activities.

Student clubs or societies shall be recognized as school organizations if they are authorized by the school administration, supervised by school personnel, composed completely of current student body members, hold the majority of meetings at school and establish aims that are educational and of school or community interest and approved by the Board of Education on an annual basis in September.
