- **Step 4.** Gently press each piece of dough with the bottom of a glass to flatten.
- **Step 5.** Bake for 9 minutes.
- **Step 6.** Upon removing the cookies from the oven, gently press the M&Ms into the tops of the cookies to form a flower shape.
- **Step 7**. Let cool before eating.


# BENEFITS OF HAVING MUSIC IN YOUR LIFE



# Chernobyl: The disaster that changed the world By Joey G.


