Letter from Superintendent Ryan Rieber was

Dedication and Determination

The musician Usher said, "Success is about dedication... you've got to be willing to have vision and foresight that leads you to an incredible end." As we turn the calendar to April, this is a crucial month for the School District of West Salem. There is a referendum question on the ballot that will determine the financial path for the district for the next three years. The ballot will include a non-recurring referendum question seeking permission to exceed the revenue limit by \$2.5 million in 2023, \$2.5 million in 2024, and \$2.75 million in 2025. If this referendum question were to pass, the mill rate for our district residents would decrease from the current rate of \$9.15 to \$8.32. This would be the lowest mill rate in the School District of West Salem in over 20 years. The average mill rate in West Salem over the past 20 years has been \$9.68. We are dedicated to continuing the high level of education and maintenance of our facilities for a low cost to our community, and decreasing your school portion of your taxes in the process.

Over the past three years, the West Salem School Board

was successful in keeping promises and met the goals presented leading up to the question that is on the ballot on April 5th. The School Board is determined to do the same thing over the course of the next three years. The focus will continue to be in the following areas:

- 1) Maintain "The West Salem Way" with quality programming that sets us apart from all other area districts. This funding is necessary to maintain our current program offerings for our students. If the referendum fails, some of these programs will need to be reduced.
- 2) Keep and maintain competitive wages and benefits for our staff, continue funding our transportation department and provide upkeep of our bus fleet, complete the roof replacement at our elementary school and high school, fund additional maintenance and upkeep at the elementary and middle school, add additional parking around the Panther Den and athletic facilities, as well as make repairs and updates at our Outdoor Education Center (OEC).
- 3) The current non-recurring operational referendum expires on June 30, 2022, which is the end of the current fiscal year. We are essentially seeking an additional \$600,000 from what was asked in 2019 while also reducing your school taxes.

If this referendum passes, we will continue to offer top notch program offerings for our students, and our per pupil expenditures will continue to be less than the state average, all while providing tax relief to our community. Our community has been dedicated and determined to provide the highest quality education for our students, and the Schoool District of West Salem has the same vision. We, too, are dedicated and determined to continue to provide the highest quality of education for our children, but we need your continued help and support. Please reach out to me if you have any questions about the referendum before the upcoming vote on April 5, or visit our school website at bit.ly/WSalemReferendum.

Speaking of dedication and determination, the upcoming school board election will mark the end of Mr. Ken Schlimgen's time in serving our students, schools, and community on our school board. I would like to thank Ken for his time on our board and for helping to partner to make our school district second to none around the area. Thank you for your service, Ken, and we wish you the best in your future endeavors.

Thank you for taking the time to read and for your consideration of the big referendum decision ahead. Please mark your calendars now to vote on April 5th.

West Salem Boys Basketball Makes History with First Ever Trip to State Tournament

After an outstanding regular season in which they finished with a record of 26-1 and took home the Coulee Conference title along with a #1 Seed in the Division 3 playoffs, the West Salem Boys Basketball team battled their way through the regional and sectional semifinals to make it to the state tournament for the first time in

program history with first year coach Mark Wagner. The Panthers headed to the Kohl Center in Madison on March 17 for the first game of the tournament. Panther pride was on full display as students, parents, and community members filled the stands to cheer them on. They worked hard all game and finished on top against Brillion to qualify for the Division 3

Championship. Junior Carson Koepnick led the team with 26 points, followed by junior Brett McConkey with 14 points and senior Brennan Kennedy with 9 points. Both offensive and defensive rebounds helped the team pull out the win, with McConkey pulling down 14 and junior Peter Lattos coming up with 12.



While they started out strong with 9 points in the first three minutes and up two points at halftime, shots weren't falling in the second half and they fell to LCL with a final score of 56-67. 

Referendum Details

At an election in the School District of West Salem on Tuesday, April 5, 2022, the following question will be submitted to a vote of the people:

"Shall the School District of West Salem, La Crosse County, Wisconsin be authorized to exceed the revenue limit specified in Section 121.91, Wisconsin Statutes, by \$2,500,000 for the 2022-2023 school year, by \$2,500,000 for the 2023-2024 school year and by \$2,750,000 for the 2024-2025 school year, for non-recurring purposes consisting of maintaining educational programming, facilities and buses and paying salary and other operational expenses?"

A copy of the entire text of the resolution directing submission of the question set forth above to the electorate and information concerning District boundaries can be obtained from the District Clerk at the School District offices located at 405 East Hamlin Street, West Salem, Wisconsin.
