Getting Creative with At-Home Science

Throughout November, Mr. Baker's 7th grade science students got creative by taking their science experiments into their homes! Students learned all about the different processes cells use to get their energy, including photosynthesis, respiration, and fermentation. They conducted a fermentation study by baking bread, which involves alcoholic fermentation, or by doing a workout, which involves lactic acid fermentation. With cells out of the way, they will be starting to learn about body systems and students will be creating their own experiments based on a single body system.


