4K Registration and Screening 2021-2022

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are not able to safely host our "traditional" 4K registration and screening events this year. Instead we will be hosting a virtual 4K registration event and inviting families to sign up for an in-person screening opportunity. Assuming community numbers allow, we will host small group screening sessions at the elementary school.

West Salem School District 3 yr. old Child Development Days

As part of ongoing Child-Find efforts our district is committed to ensuring that we keep up with screening children even during this time of enhanced safety measures due to COVID-19. We have changed our screening process for the 2020-2021 school year. This change will allow us to continue to screen and make early identifications of children who may need extra help now or in the near future.

We traditionally host an in-person screening event in February paired with a parent questionnaire. This year we are going to use Ages and Stages (ASQ) and/or Ages and Stages Online. If you have a child who will be three years old by September 1, 2021 please contact Amber Clark at 608-786-1662 ext 3117 or

Once screening results are received (online or paper), someone from the Early Childhood team will contact you with your child's results. An optional virtual or in-person observation may be offered if there are any developmental concerns.

Kindergarten Registration 2021-2022

Now that West Salem has a 4-Year-Old Kindergarten program in place, we no longer have a kindergarten registration. If you have a student who will be five years old by September 1, 2021 and your child does not attend our 4K program, please contact the elementary office at 786-1662 to pre-register. All 4K students currently attending West Salem's program will automatically receive kindergarten enrollment information.

2021 K-4 Summer School Program

Important Message from the Principal regarding Personal Devices:

Personal Devices updates for parents: Use of personal devices: Our handbook states: Personal Property Electronic Devices (Cell Phones, Games, Music Players, etc.) Reference: Board Policy 443.3 Students may not use cell phones or other 2-way communication devices during school hours (7:30am-3:10pm). If a student is seen with their cell phone, they will be considered in violation of this policy. An exception is if a teacher would request students to use cell phones for an educational purpose. Students violating this policy shall be disciplined in accordance with the established procedures as follows: First Offense: Phone confiscated, warning given and the phone returned to the student at the end of the school day. Second and Subsequent Offense: Phone confiscated and a parent must come to school to retrieve the phone. After multiple offenses, other consequences may be assigned including, but not limited to, detentions. Cell phones are strictly prohibited in the locker rooms at all times. If a student is found using their cell phone in the locker room, the phone will automatically be confiscated and a parent will be required to come in to retrieve the phone.

Students may bring personal electronic devices to school to use during inside recess (inclement weather) as long as games, music, etc. are appropriate for the school setting. Students are not allowed to use electronics during outside recess. Personal electronic devices may be used for instructional purposes with teacher permission. We emphasize that the school is NOT responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items. Please note that student lockers DO NOT lock. Use of inappropriate websites, games, etc.may result in disciplinary action

**The underlined sentence about recess and use was in effect before all students had 1:1 district-issued devices this year. In looking to give students some entertainment during inclement weather, this was allowed. Now that all students have a school-issued device, all personal devices are not to be used during school hours, as originally stated in the first part of this language. Another bonus of having school-issued devices is the opportunity for educational play during such times! Thank you!
