REFERENDUM PROJECT UPDATES

What is Happening with the Construction Projects?

After the community approved the capital referendum projects in November 2024, there has been plenty of work going on behind the scenes to make these projects become a reality. Staff at our elementary school and high school have had several meetings with our project managers and architects at ISG and construction manager Kraus-Anderson, to offer their input and feedback on design and various project elements. From floor plan layout to door hardware, planning is in full swing.

Elementary Gym

At the elementary school, the design phase for the new gym is nearly complete. The photos to the right show the preliminary design of the interior and exterior of the new gym addition. The next phase of the process is the creation of construction documents, which we estimate will be completed by July.

High School

User group meetings continue at the high school, and staff members have had a chance to meet with ISG and Kraus-Anderson at least twice to offer feedback and review various elements of the project. Two community group meetings with various business owners and industry experts in the career and technical education field were held. Industry experts offered insight on what skills are valuable for their employees to have, as well as industry-best practices. This insight is crucial to making sure these new spaces serve our students and allow them to develop skills that are in demand in the workforce. Floor plan development and remaining design features continue. We anticipate this phase will be wrapped up by July.
