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Letter from Superintendent Ryan Rieber

Opportunities

I think we will all agree that this school year has been one of the challenges, changes, controversy, and adaptations, but I hope that we all take a moment, put disagreement aside, and reflect on the opportunities that we were able to provide for our students and community over the course of this most unusual year. The end of the year provides the opportunity for reflection, and as we reflect on this school year, there is a lot to be proud of.

As the District prepared for the year in collaboration with other area districts, we ventured into virtual learning and provided the Coulee Region Virtual Academy as an alternative for our families. This provided families an at-home option and consistency in an inconsistent environment during the first part of the year. As a school district, I believe that it is our responsibility to provide these opportunities for growth and choice with a keen eye for continuous improvement.

Mrs. Griffin announced the following Hearing: Public hearing as required by State Statute 118.38 (1) (b): The School District of West Salem is seeking waivers from the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) for certain requirements as described in Wisconsin State Statutes 121.02 (1) (f), 121.006(2)(a), 120.12(15), and 121.02(1)(j). Specifically, the District seeks:

Waiver of the requirements of Hours of Instruction, to meet Wis. Stat. §§ 121.02(1)(f) and 121.006(2)(a) and the administrative rules promulgated by the department regarding requiring school districts to annually schedule at least 437 hours of direct pupil instruction in kindergarten, at least 1,050 hours of direct pupil instruction in grades 1 to 6, and at least 1,137 hours of direct pupil instruction in grades 7 to 12. Specifies what may and may not be included in scheduled hours. Instructional hours for students for the 2020-2021 school year only due to the COVID-19 pandemic;

Waiver of the requirements for the Length of the school day requiring school boards to establish rules for scheduling hours in a normal school day, to meet Wis. Stat. § 120.12(15) for the 2020-21 school year only due to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

Waiver of the requirements for school districts to ensure that instruction in elementary and high schools in health and physical education, art, and music is provided by qualified teacher, to meet Wis. Stat. 121.02(1)(j) for the 2020-21 school year only due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

There was no public input.

Mr. Schlimgen Mrs. Fitzgerald seconded to adopt the following resolution: SCHOOL BOARD RESOLUTION FOR THE WAIVER OF CERTAIN SCHOOL BOARD OR SCHOOL DISTRICT REQUIREMENTS PURSUANT TO WIS. STAT. §§ 118.38(1) AND (1m)

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. §118.38(1) authorize school boards to request the Department of Public Instruction to waive any school board or school district requirement in Wis. Stat. chs. 115 to 121 or in the administrative rules promulgated by the Department under the authority of those chapters; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. §118.38(1)(b) requires that, before requesting a waiver, a school board shall hold a public hearing in the school district on the request for a waiver of any requirement in Wis. Stat. chs. 115 to 121; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 118.38(1m) requires that "the school board shall specify in its request for a waiver its reason for requesting the waiver," which includes the mandated state-wide closure of schools in response to the COVID-19 health emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that:

1. On May 24, 2021, the Board of Education held a public hearing, in satisfaction of Wis. Stat. \$118.38(1)(b), concerning requests for waivers of the requirements identified herein; and

2. In compliance with Wis. Stat. §§ 118.38(1) and (1m), and for the reasons set forth herein, the Board of Education hereby directs the District Administrator or his/her designee to apply, on behalf of the Board, to the Office of the Superintendent for Public Instruction (OSPI) for the waiver of the following:

a. Waiver of the requirements of Hours of Instruction, to meet Wis. Stat. §§ 121.02(1)(f) and 121.006(2)(a) and the administrative rules promulgated by the department regarding requiring school districts to annually schedule at least 437 hours of direct pupil instruction in kindergarten, at least 1,050 hours of direct pupil instruction in grades 1 to 6, and at least 1,137 hours of direct pupil instruction in grades 7 to 12. Specifies what

may and may not be included in scheduled hours. Instructional hours for students for the 2020-2021 school year only due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

b. Waiver of the requirements for the Length of the school day requiring school boards to establish rules for scheduling hours in a normal school day, to meet Wis. Stat. § 120.12(15) for the 2020-21 school year only due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

c. Waiver of the requirements for school districts to ensure that instruction in elementary and high schools in health and physical education, art, and music is provided by qualified teacher, to meet Wis. Stat. §121.02(1)(j) for the 2020-21 school year only due to the COVID-19 pandemic. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that execution of this Resolution is conclusive evidence of the Board of Education's approval of this action and of the authority granted herein at a duly-noticed meeting of the Board held on May 24, 2021.

Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Schlimgen moved, Mr. Gavaghan seconded to approve the nutrition Services Management Agreement with the School District of Bangor for the 2021-2022 school year. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Schlimgen moved, Mrs. Fitzgerald seconded to accept the administrations recommendation to approve the open enrollment requests, except for the for students noted on the list provided. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Grosskopf moved, Mr. E. Peterson seconded to approve a high school paraprofessional for 5.75 hour per day for the high school at-risk program for the 2021-2022 school year. Motion carried unanimously.

Mr. Gavaghan moved, Mr. Schlimgen seconded to approve the administration's request for the 2021-2022 school year, to split a full-time cook's position and make 2 positions, a 5.75 and a 5.5 hours per day. Motion carried unanimously.

The list of to do items / information requests was reviewed. No action was taken.

Adjournment Mr. Schlimgen moved, Mr. C Peterson seconded to adjourn at 8:05 p.m. Motion carried unanimously.
