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Letter from Superintendent Ryan Rieber

The Next Chapter

Annually, the high school yearbook staff announces the yearbook theme in conjunction with the yearbook dedicatee. This year's theme was "The Next Chapter," and the dedicatee was Mrs. Amy Marshall. Amy is an outstanding person who loves the students and staff she works with. She is a giving individual who truly "Serves with Passion." Also, during this assembly, we recognize the newest inductees of the West Salem High School Hall of Fame. This tradition began four years ago by Mr. Troy Gunderson to bring recognition to those who have made West Salem such a special place to be. This year's inductees are Bob Gorniak, Mike Greene, and Damian Miller.

All three inductees had inspiring words and experiences that they shared with our students. Bob Gorniak has served as a coach, mentor, and role model for student-athletes in West Salem for over 44 years. Damian Miller had an impressive eleven-year career in major league baseball, highlighted by a World Series title and

an All Star Game appearance. Mike Greene was the 1985 valedictorian, a member of the UN peacekeeping forces in Haiti and El Salvador, along with being a part of a nonprofit group assisting people of San Lucas, Guatemala. Placing the accomplishments of these three inductees into one sentence does not do justice to how they have continued to "Serve with Passion" past their years as students in West Salem. Congratulations to Bob, Damian, Mike, and their families!

While speaking to the students, Mike Greene encouraged the students to not wait for something to happen in their lives, but to go out and make it happen. He also suggested that our students should find a way to become involved in something bigger than themselves. As part of his talk, he encouraged students to be present and not step out and miss the moments in their lives. The more present that we are, the more involved we will be, and the more memorable moments we will have. A very good piece of advice for all of us, as each day of our lives is an opportunity.

This was a very fitting way for our high school seniors to end their time in our district as they prepare for their "Next Chapters."

WHEREAS, by adopting this Resolution, the Board of Education declares their support for the School District of West Salem's submission of the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant application, administered by WisDOT, to fund a traffic study around the School District of West Salem campus.

WHEREAS, the School District of West Salem will maintain records documenting all expenditures made during the grant period and abide by the necessary reporting responsibilities as determined by the WisDOT; and

WHEREAS, the School District of West Salem will work cooperatively with employees, agents, and representatives of the WisDOT during the grant period; and

WHEREAS, the School District of West Salem intends to comply with all requirements of and will submit all documents and participation requirements to the WisDOT; and

WHEREAS, the West Salem Board of Education finds that the submission of this grant will be in the best interest of and benefit to the School District, students, families, and the community of West Salem, its properties, its residents, and taxpayers.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WEST SALEM BOARD OF EDUCATION that the School Board supports the proposal to conduct a traffic study around the School District of West Salem campus with the help and support of the Safe Routes to School and the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) grant application.
