lt is that time of the year when we have many students needing to change out of wet or muddy pants and socks. Please send an extra pair of <u>pants and socks</u> with your child that can be kept in their locker or backpack. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

The nurse's office is in need of gently used pants. <u>Size 6 through 12 elastic waist pants</u> work well. If you have any to donate, please drop them off in the elementary office.

# When to Keep Your Child Home

- Fever: greater than 100 degrees. For fever and flu symptoms, a student should not return to school until the fever has been gone for 24 hours without the use of medication.
- Vomiting: return 24 hours after vomiting stops
- Diarrhea: return 24 hours after diarrhea stops
- Rash: rash that is open and draining or a rash with a fever
- Contagious Diseases: (strep throat, impetigo, pink eye) A student may return after 24 hours of treatment with antibiotic
- Nuisance Diseases: head lice, scabies, ringworm must be treated before returning to school
- Chicken Pox: child may return to school 5-7 days after onset of rash, with all sores dry and scabbed over
- Please notify your child's school if your child is absent due to illness or injury.

### COMMON WINTER HEALTH CONCERNS

### Flu Season is Here!

As we spend more time inside buildings, the flu season pays us a Wisconsin visit. Flu is a layman term for the influenza viral infection. The virus is transmitted by coughing, sneezing, contact with used tissues or contaminated hands and objects. The symptoms of influenza include:

- Fever with body temperature 100 degrees Fahrenheit or more
- Common respiratory problems such as cold and cough
- Congestion and runny nose
- Headache accompanied by muscle pains
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Chills and Fatigue

Prevention can be your best defense. Teach your child proper coughing and sneezing etiquette by using the inside of your elbow instead of you hand. Encourage proper disposal of tissues. Keep hands away for the face area. Frequent hand washing decreases the spread of infection. Stay home when you are ill. Get plenty of rest and eating a balance diet. Talk with your medical provider or health department and consider receiving the influenza vaccine to help prevent the influenza infection. \*\*Students should stay home until fever free for a FULL 24-hours and are able to fully participate in school activities.\*\*

## **Cough Drops**

Students must have a Medication Procedure form signed by parent/guardian on file in the health office in order to have cough drops at school. Cough drops must be located in the health office. Many parent signed this form at the beginning of the school year online.

### **Chap Stick**

A good idea this time of year is to have your student bring chap stick to school to keep in their desk or their backpack to use for dry lips. This eliminates trips to the health office to have vaseline applied during the school day.

#### Stomach "Bugs"

Often caused by norovirus, stomach "flu" or "bug" is highly contagious. Prevention includes frequent hand washing and cleaning contaminated surfaces and laundry. \*\*Students must remain home for a minimum of 24 hours after vomiting, diarrhea and/or fever stops. They should be able to tolerate normal meals before returning to school.\*\*

#### Strep Throat

Strep throat is caused by a bacterial infection and is more common in children than adults. As with other illnesses, prevention involves hand washing and covering coughs and sneezes. Symptoms include sore throat and fever. Testing at a doctor's office is needed to diagnose and treatment involves antibiotics. \*\*Students should not return to school until 24 hours after starting antibiotics and being fever-free.\*\*

#### **Head Lice**

Head lice are a common annoyance and can occur year-round. They do not cause illness and do not jump or fly. Lice are primarily spread through direct head-to-head contact, and less commonly through shared personal items. Lice medicines kill live lice; your doctor can make suggestions for specific products. \*\*Children should be taught to avoid sharing items such as hats, combs, brushes, scarves and pillows.\*\*
