# Meet Your Candidates for West Salem School Board

In the Spring Election on April 2, 2024 there will be two seats open on the West Salem School Board. The three candidates that have filed to fill these positions are: Bob Gollnik, Matt Knebes, and Caitlin Wilson. Please remember to vote on April 2! Voting locations can be found on page 8.

### 1) What motivates you to become a board member?

A: "I am motivated by a commitment to education and using my role as a school board member to embrace and expand the reputation of West Salem as a top school district in the area, while exploring ways to foster innovation and opportunities for our students at all skill and ability levels. I currently have two students attending the School District of West Salem and have lived in West Salem since 2017. I am interested in maximizing educational opportunities and innovation for students at a district of our size while being fiscally responsible. I believe that strong schools and strong communities create strong opportunities for students and vice versa. I view this as an opportunity to help grow students into capable, connected, and contributing members of the community, while positioning them for success upon graduation. Lastly, my professional life revolves around planning and resource allocation, so I am familiar with the collaborative process of policy development and how decisions are made and implemented."

### 2) What do you see as the board's roles and responsibilities?

**A:** "I see the board's fundamental responsibility as providing staff and students the training and resources they need to be successful. This revolves around policy development, budget approval and analysis, community stewardship, curriculum

oversight, facilities management, and political advocacy as highlighted below: Policy Development: Develop and adop targeted policies that govern the operation of schools within the district. Budget Approval: Work with district administrators to allocate funds appropriately, ensuring that resources are allocated efficiently to support educational goals. Community Stewardship: Engage with the community and serve as a link between the community and the school district. Curriculum Oversight: Oversee the curriculum offered by the district, and work with educators to align and exceed state standards while preparing students for career and college readiness. Legal Compliance: Ensure compliance with education laws, labor laws, and other regulations. Facilities Management: Work with staff to manage maintenance, construction, and renovation of school facilities. Advocacy: Advocate the needs of the district to legislators and stakeholders at the state and local levels."

### 3) What is the most important responsibility of a school board?

**A:** "The school board's most important responsibility is the development and oversight of policy, in order to cultivate and sustain an environment that supports effective teaching and learning. Through a positive, collaborative, and productive atmosphere, policies can be objectively developed, evaluated, and revised to suit the changing trends and needs. Effective implementation is crucial for creating a successful and balanced community and school district."

## 4) What issues do you believe the district needs to address in its academic program and offerings? What changes would you recommend?

A: "I'm not familiar with the breadth and depth of academic program offerings, and don't have any specific recommendations without knowing the full range of opportunities available and how they are being implemented. I think considering a number of questions would help guide any potential changes, such as: What opportunities do other school districts similar to our size and means offer? What are best practices we can learn from our cohorts and peers? Why do families open enroll in or out ?How can student data help inform us regarding successes and shortcomings? For those entering the workforce and technical training, what are skills that are in demand in our region and how can we proactively prepare students for them? For those pursuing advanced education, what are strengths and weaknesses from their preparation at West Salem School District? Generally, I am supportive of regular evaluation of academic programming, offerings, and instructional practices to best prepare students for a range of post-graduation opportunities and expanding higher education, industry, and other partnerships to maximize success of students. I am also supportive of strategic budgeting to maximize the value of fiscal decisions made by the board wherever possible."

# Meet Your Candidates for West Salem School Board

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### 1) What motivates you to become a board member?

**A:** "Being a part of the community I wanted to contribute to our children's future. I feel the board has done a great job and now it's my turn to help."

### 2) What do you see as the board's roles and responsibilities?

**A:** "Helping in discussions and decisions on the kids & schools' goals and growth."

### 3) What is the most important responsibility of a school board?

A: "To make decisions based on our children's safety, education and future."

4) What issues do you believe the district needs to address in its academic program and offerings?

### What changes would you recommend?

**A:** "Continuing growth and partnership with the trades and community. Keep an open dialogue with companies in the area, get feedback from them on some of their expectations to better prepare our youth in the next chapters in their future."

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### 1) What motivates you to become a board member?

Second, I have no changes I'm recommending at this time. I intend to spend time listening and learning to understand our challenges, opportunities, strengths and weaknesses, before advocating for change."


