





# Connecting Curriculum & Giving

Our 8th Grade English Language Arts classes recently completed an awesome outreach project in conjunction with their class read aloud, the book "No Fixed Address" by Susin Nielsen. The book is about a middle school boy who is homeless and lives in his van with his mom. The students learned that we have a significant population in the La Crosse area that is unhomed, so they wanted to do something to help! After talking with people involved with the unhomed, the students learned their biggest needs right now are socks, chapsticks, and snacks, so they had a drive to gather those items. They made it a competition between Mrs. Sackett's and Mrs. Meyer's ELA classes to see who could collect the most, and the 8th graders responded in a big way, bringing in 173 pairs of socks, 360 sticks of chapstick and over 600 individual snacks!

Students then came to help assemble the bags, and they were able to put together 173 bags that were delivered to the Econolodge, the The Salvation Army of La Crosse County, and the Catholic Charities Warming Center. What an excellent way of combining class material and serving their community with passion!
