

Learning How to "Adult"

Students in Paul Liethen's classes are no strangers to hands-on work, but the most recent addition to his class schedule has them learning how to "adult."

The class is called "Adulting" and is in its second year being offered at West Salem High School. The class is offered exclusively to seniors, and students learn a variety of hands-on skills that will help them to be successful in life and on their own, such as how to start a charcoal grill, how to change the oil in a car, and how to sew on a button.

The latest skill they are learning is how to repair a hole in drywall. To start, Liethen set up small pieces of drywall mounted to a frame, and allowed students to bust a hole into them. While making the hole might have been fun, next, they needed to put their skills to work and figure out how to repair it. Step by step, they framed out where the repair needed to go, measured and cut their drywall, and used drywall tape and spackle to repair the hole. Next, they sanded down their spackle, added some texture, and finished things off with a nice coat of paint.

During each step of the process, students had to figure out the best way to problem solve and move forward when they ran into issues. They enjoyed every bit of the hands-on work and left the lesson with a genuine feeling of accomplishment.

Mr. Mathison's students will even

be able to repurpose the drywall by using it to practice electrical and wiring. The students' next assignment is to pick a how-to topic of their own, and create instructions and a presentation for their classmates.

Nondiscrimination on the Basis of Sex in Education Programs or Activities
