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## Letter from Superintendent Troy Gunderson

### School Referendum – Q & A

On Tuesday, November 8th, the election ballot will include two referendum questions for the School District of West Salem. Detailed descriptions about the scope of these two questions are included in this newsletter and in recent school district publications. The following are commonly asked questions during the last few weeks:

#### **Why are we remodeling the middle school instead of building a new one?**

The survey of district residents completed after the April, 2015 referendum indicated a desire to renovate the middle school rather than replace it. The school district responded by selecting an architect with renovation expertise, and is confident the current plan for renovation and addition will result in a building equal in quality

to new construction at a lower cost. The proposed project offers complete renovation and a doubling of the size of our middle school. For reference, the project will be similar in scope to the work completed at our high school in 2002. From a financial perspective, passage of both Question #1 and Question #2 will cost approximately \$12 million less, including interest over the time of the loan, than the proposed new middle school offered for referendum in April of 2015.

#### **How many students does our elementary school serve?**

The elementary school currently serves 860 students in grades four-year-old kindergarten (4k) through 5. When the building originally opened in 1996, it served 654 students.

**Why are we moving the 5th grade to the middle school?**

Moving the 5th grade to the middle school allows the district to address crowding at the elementary school and to improve programming at our middle school. Moving the 5th grade to the middle school will reduce the population of our elementary school by approximately 125 students per year.

**Why are we including the Boys and Girls Club?**

The Boys & Girls Club (BGC) is included because they are in desperate need for space and have pledged to contribute additional funding to the project. Also, the proposed renovations will allow them to better serve our children and their families at no additional cost to the taxpayer. The BGC currently serves more than 125 of our students and their families every day. Through the generosity of their donors, the BGC will contribute \$2.5 million to the proposed project creating a number of shared facilities the school district can use during the day.

**How can my taxes go down even if this passes?**

Your taxes will go down because district operational costs have declined and the proposed new debt payment will remain the same as the current debt payment all while property values are expanding. To this point, on October 24th, the school board set the 2017 mil rate at \$9.42 thereby reducing taxes by \$78 on a \$100,000. This new tax rate is 7% lower than the current rate because of the revenue limit, state aid, and increasing property values. This new tax rate includes a \$1,900,000 debt payment on our high school and swimming pool. If both referendum questions pass, the district will combine existing debt with the new debt and commit to making roughly the same payment for 20 years, meaning the tax rate will remain at or near \$9.42 for the foreseeable future. If the referendum questions both fail, the district plans

to pay off the remaining high school/swimming pool debt over the next three years, meaning the tax rate would remain at or around \$9.42 for three years and then decline by as much as \$2.40 in 2020 when the district becomes debt free.

**What is a multi-purpose events facility?**

We envision the proposed multi-purpose events facility as the centerpiece to the proposed additions to our athletic complex. The facility is to include restrooms and concessions for soccer, softball, tennis, cross-country and lower-level football. The facility will also include a large open space big enough to host indoor ice hockey games, serve as an indoor practice area for many outdoor sports, and serve as an indoor community center designed to host a wide range of public events.

**How will these projects improve campus safety and congestion?**

The projects include funding for an off-street bus loading area, a new access road from the east, and a new front entry and drop off for our middle school facing south onto East Avenue. The new bus loading area, included in Question #1, will be located to the north of our elementary school and the new access road, included in Question #2, will connect to Garland Street near Lakeview Health Center. These several changes to our campus infrastructure will reduce traffic on Mark Street. In addition, the new entrance to our middle school will include a secure passage into the office area for use during the day similar to the arrangements at our elementary school and high school.

The West Salem School District School Board has approved the following school district referendum. The referendum will consist of two questions. The first will include renovations and additions to the middle school and updates to the elementary school.

# Referendum Question 1

## \$20,000,000

Approval of Question #1 would allow the school district to complete the following:

### Middle School


- Two-story addition, including four individual grade level pods; one for each grade, 5-8. Each pod would contain classrooms and a center gathering space for lockers.
- Single-story space containing a cafeteria/commons area, kitchen, music/choir area, secure entry connected to the office, and a two-station gymnasium.
- The funds provided by the Boys' and Girls' Club will be used to create a "new" club within the building by renovating

- the current middle school basement, locker rooms, gymnasium, and east entry.
- Renovations and system modifications would include: ADA compliance, heating, air conditioning, ventilation, fire alarm, electrical service, roofing, doors and windows.

### Elementary School

- A dedicated bus transfer area
- Additional parking
- Improved cafeteria serving area
- An events entrance
- Building infrastructure

## QUESTION NUMBER I





The West Salem School District School Board has approved the following school district referendum. The referendum will consist of two questions. The second will address improvements to several campus facilities including the construction of a multi-purpose events facility.

## Referendum Question 2

### \$5,000,000

Approval of Question #2 would allow the school district to complete the following:

#### Improvements to Campus Facilities

- Renovation of the running track
- Construction of additional seating in the football/track stadium
- Construction of three-diamond softball complex and renovation of the current varsity softball diamond into a junior varsity baseball diamond
- Construction of a new eight-court tennis facility
- Completion of the related site improvements to include a parking lot and access road

#### Construction of a Multi-Purpose Events Facility

- The proposed multi-purpose events facility is a large open space facility that will serve

as the center of a sports complex located near the current soccer fields. The building will accommodate a number of school related activities including:

1. Ice hockey
  2. Indoor practice for soccer, softball, baseball, track, and tennis
- The restroom, concession, and changing areas will be designed to service the surrounding outdoor events, including soccer games, softball games, tennis matches, and cross country meets.
  - This facility is also expected to function as a community events center with the ability to host a wide range of activities and events.

## LETTER FROM ELEMENTARY PRINCIPAL RYAN RIEBER

November 8th is an important day for the West Salem community as it provides everyone an opportunity to impact the lives of generations of West Salem students and families. Although the focus is on the addition to West Salem Middle School, the proposed project will have many positive implications on the elementary school as well.

One of the more notable changes would be our fifth grade students and staff moving to the middle school. When the elementary school was built in 1996, the building was constructed for student numbers in the lower to mid 700's. Over the years, the student population in the elementary school has continued to grow, and our current enrollment at the elementary school is 877 students. Moving a class of students to a newly renovated middle school would decrease our student population by an average of 120 students per year, allowing the district to operate at the intended target population of the building.

The sheer number of students within the elementary school has many impacts on the students experience here at WSES including, but not limited to our

lunch room and serving area, library, and access to areas for some students that need it most. With the numbers of students that we have, there is a constant shuffling of classrooms, which has resulted in grade levels within the elementary losing out on our intended "Pod" concept of having all grade level students together. This is the concept that we are attempting to accomplish with a potential addition to the middle school, and the removal of pressure from the elementary school would allow us to return back to the elementary school's "Pod" concept.

Another area that would be addressed with this is a proposed new bus transfer area and moving the middle school entrance to East Avenue. This would free up and decrease the crowding and congestion at pick up and drop off times for students. Also to help with this there is a proposed additional parking/hard surface area. The construction of this would allow a better free flow of traffic on the South end of the elementary school.

Security and safety are always in the forefront of our minds. Recently, there was a secured entrance added onto the elementary school for visitors to check in prior to entering the elementary school. The proposed project would include improving the entrance to the building for sporting events. Currently, access to the building for sporting events is through the front of the elementary school, which allows any visitor for sporting events access to the entire building. In looking to help make our elementary building more secure, improvements to the entrance to our cafeteria area for sporting events would allow us to limit access into the elementary school and contain the crowds for sporting events to our commons area.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Syl Clements. ### Connection with the Community

Simon Buchanan reported on:

1. As a part of her Senior Exit Project, Katie Krien organized a mock accident that took place on September 27. The project was meant to show high school students the consequences of drinking and driving. She created a short movie setting the scene of a drunk driving crash, which led to a live conclusion with first responders, firefighters and police responding to the crash outside the high school. Katie acted in the mock crash and involved other classmates in the production. Students also heard from the mother of a student who was hit by a drunk driver after the mock accident. The end result of the project was very impactful for many students.
2. The high school band, consisting of nearly 150 students, marched at Oktoberfest on October 1. The band placed third behind Holmen and Onalaska. This was the last parade of the year for the whole band, but some students will be marching in Disney during the music trip in November.




# VOTE NOVEMBER 8
