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Letter from Superintendent **Ryan Rieber**

It's a Thankful Time to Be a Panther

What a fall it has been for our students and student-athletes. Our fall athletes have shined and continue to bring Panther Pride with their successful performances inside and outside the classroom. Our student-athletes have found tremendous success, including conference championships, playoff success, congratulations to our volleyball team for making it to the sectional finals, football for a trip to the third round of the playoffs, and a second straight trip to state for our boys and girls cross-country teams, which both placed in the top ten.

The annual budget development cycle concluded on Monday, October 24th, when the school board approved the final 2022-2023 school budget and tax levy. The school board adopted the last budget to include a tax levy of \$9,536,752 with a mill rate of \$7.73. This is a decrease of 4.12% from a year ago, paired with the lowest mill rate in over twenty years. Despite record-high inflation, rising prices, and an approximately 14% increase in property value, our Board voted to lower the school portion of taxes. The District asked for your

support this past April, and we have fulfilled what we said we would do with the district's tax levy and mill rate.

One item impacting the District and our community taxpayers is our contributions to local private schools. A year ago, the District taxpayer's contribution was \$444,583, and this year that increased to \$595,876. The West Salem School District taxpayer contribution to local private schools has increased by 855% since the 2018-19 school year. For reference, our local taxpayer's contributions to local private schools were \$69,694 in 2018-19, compared to the \$595,876 it is today. This had an approximate \$0.48 impact on our mill rate this year. It is important for everyone to understand all of the areas that impact our budget.

An area that I would like to highlight is our academic achievement here in West Salem. There has been a lot of publicity lately about the decline in student achievement nationally and within our state. This publicity around reading and math scores comes from the "Nation's Report Card," which is the first one that has come out since the pandemic began. On November 15th, our district report cards will be released for public viewing.

Preliminary results are positive for West Salem! As we look at our district reading and math scores, our district continues to do well when comparing us with the rest of the state. There will be more information that we will be sharing after the public release, as well as our newly developed "District Scorecards."

There are many reasons we can sustain the success of our district, from our staff to our supportive parents and community, valuing in-person instruction, as well as our high expectations and standards. Eckhart Tolle stated, "Acknowledging the good that you have in life is the foundation of all abundance." In this time of thanksgiving, I want to thank you for all you do to continue making the West Salem School District and community a wonderful place to live, work, and educate our children!

WSMS Solar System Up and Running

The solar project at West Salem Middle School is officially completed and up and running! Superintendent Ryan Rieber flipped the switch on October 19th and the panels have already produced over 4 MWh at this time. It is estimated that the solar panels will offset approximately 28% of the building's energy usage throughout the year. Staff, students, and community members can view how much energy the system is producing through an online dashboard that can be found on our website under "Community."

The system is already providing educational opportunities for our students, with our high school Advanced Placement Environmental Science students taking a trip over to the middle school to check out the system and learn about the annual savings to the district and the environmental benefits. Later this year, they will also look at how much the system is reducing the district's carbon footprint. We are so grateful to our donors that made this project possible and we can't wait to see the benefits of this system for years to come!




