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# **Letter from Superintendent** Ryan Rieber

### **Welcome to November**

It has been a great start of the school year for our students and student-athletes. Our fall athletes shined brightly and continued to bring Panther Pride with their successful performances inside and outside the classroom, including conference championships and playoff victories. Congratulations to our state qualifiers in tennis, our football team for reaching level 2 of the playoffs, the volleyball team who made it to sectionals, and our boys and girls cross-country teams for earning a third straight trip to state, with the boys finishing fourth and the girls placing eleventh this past weekend!

Our annual budget development cycle concluded on Monday, October 23rd when the school board approved the final 2023-2024 school budget and tax levy. The school board adopted the budget to include a tax levy of \$10,710,208 with a mill rate of \$7.60. The tax levy increased this year for several reasons, including inflation, rising prices, and another year of increased property values in the district, which are up an average of 13.9%.

However, the higher tax levy is paired with the lowest mill rate in over twenty years. This year's tax levy is roughly \$10.7 million, up from \$9.5 million a year ago. The reasons for this include the continued increase of the equalized values on property in the school district and the increase in per-pupil reimbursement from the state from \$10k to \$11k per student. This increase in reimbursement coming from the state does affect our local taxes.


Another item impacting the District and our community taxpayers is our contribution to local private schools. A year ago, the District taxpayer contribution was \$595,876 and this year, that increased to \$617,541. The West Salem School District taxpayer contribution to local private schools has increased by 786% since the 2018-19 school year. For reference, our District taxpayer contribution to local private schools was \$69,694 in 2018-19, compared to the \$617,541 today. This had an approximate \$0.44 impact on our mill rate this year. Everyone needs to understand all of the areas that impact our budget.

On November 14th, our District and building report cards will be released publicly. We have had the Letter continues on next page...

opportunity to view these internally for the past couple of weeks and have had some good discussions around their results. Preliminary results are very similar to where they were a year ago for West Salem. Several factors go into these scores, and how scores are measured is an ever-changing process. We are very proud of our students and the work that our staff does with them. We are constantly striving to be the best! As we look at our district's reading and math scores, we continue to do well compared to the rest of the state, but there is always work to be done as we strive for the highest growth and achievement for our students. More information will be shared after the public release.

Recently, we welcomed author, educator, and speaker Jimmy Casas to our staff inservice. Mr. Casas shared four core principles with us, including 1) Be a Champion for All Kids, 2) Expect Excellence, 3) Carry the Banner, and 4) Be a Merchant of Hope. These four principles are areas that we need to focus on as a district to ensure that every child feels welcomed and is presented with opportunities to be their absolute best. I am thankful that our community entrusts the West Salem School District to work with and for their children. This is a task that everyone takes seriously. Know that we are continuously working to do our best and constantly working to get better. In this time of thanksgiving, thank you for all you do to continue making the West Salem School District and community a wonderful place to live, work, and educate our children! I wish you and all of your families a very Happy Thanksgiving!



# **A New Perspective**

Recently, 2nd grade students from Mrs. Flottmeier's class participated in a variety of activities to celebrate White Cane Day and learn more about how those with visual impairments navigate the world. This day was established in 1964 and occurs annually on October 15th to advocate for and educate about

White Cane Law and promote safe, welcoming communities for people with vision loss or blindness. While blindfolded, they practiced their morning greeting by listening for their classmates' voices and feeling their way across the classroom to give fist bumps. They also made jelly sandwiches and practiced walking through the halls blindfolded with white canes to simulate how those with vision impairment or blindness make a meal and navigate when they are out and about. These activities provided a great lesson in empathy for our students and taught them that while those with vision impairment may not be able to see everything in front of them, they utilize all of their senses and come up with creative ways to be independent!
