## **Budget and Annual Meeting Updates**

Happy November,

We recently had our Budget Hearing and Annual Meeting for our school district. The projected budget numbers that we had going into the 20-21 school year came in almost as expected. A couple of changes that came in this year's budget. One being the school district will be receiving \$160k because of a declining enrollment exemption. This is an exemption that districts are given for one year when their third Friday count in September drops. The enrollment in West Salem and across the area and state are down this year. The enrollment in West Salem is down 3% from last year, which matches the state average. A large part of this has to do with our current situation. The second area of change is additional dollars going toward private schools and private school special education voucher aid deduction to the tune of a \$200k increase. This is money that our district needs to provide to our local private schools. This will be absorbed within our budget for a total of \$450k to our local taxpayers. Taking this into account, the tax

levy was set at \$9.54, which is a penny below the \$9.55 that the school district promised upon passing the referendum in the spring of 2018.

Recently, the author Jon Gordon wrote an article about three things that a crisis will reveal about people. He said that a crisis will reveal who you are, what you value, and what you believe. I want to thank the community for how we all worked together in cooperation in order to have our students in school and participate in co-curricular activities during the month of October. The work that we have done together has allowed our students opportunities that others around us have not had.

As we move forward and with the statewide increase in COVID numbers, we are again asking for your help and support. West Salem and our surrounding communities values and supports the education of our children. Now more than ever every person plays a critical role in their education by ensuring the health and safety of our community. Our goal is to promote safety for everyone to ensure a greater likelihood of keeping our schools open. We ask that you follow health and safety guidelines. As fall transitions to winter more activities will move indoors. Please approach the upcoming

community and family events with caution and care. Our individual actions have large implications; the education of our students relies upon a healthy and safe community.

# **School Nutrition Updates**

Breakfast and Lunch are FREE to ALL students for the entire school year! USDA has extended the waiver for free meals for all children for the entire 2020-21 school year. This means all students regardless of their free/reduced status can receive a free breakfast and lunch daily when learning at school or virtually. This is exciting news that can save families time and money! Please see the details below about how each school's meal service operates so parents can feel confident sending their children to school knowing they will get a nutritious breakfast and lunch.

\*Please note that second meals, extra entees, morning milk, and ala carte items still require payment. Procedures on adding funds to the family food service account can be found on the nutrition service page on the school website. We are still accepting cash at ala carte.

## **Elementary School**

Breakfast: Breakfast in a grab and go format is available from 7:30 - 8:15 each morning. Breakfast bags are located on carts in each hallway for students to grab on the way to their classroom. If your child would like to eat breakfast, please try to arrive at school no later than 7:45 to allow ample time to enjoy breakfast. Morning supervisors are available to assist students with breakfast.

#### Middle School

Breakfast: Breakfast is served in the cafeteria from 7:30 - 8:15 each morning in a grab and go format. Students take their breakfast with them to their homeroom and consume it in the classroom.

Lunch: Lunch is served out of the cafeteria and a second service area in the basement Boys and Girls Club space. Meals are consumed in the cafeteria, basement, and Boys and Girls Club gym to allow for social distancing. There are plexiglass barriers installed and extra hand sanitizer is available and expected to be used before and after going through the lunch line. There are no self-serve options available, except where items are individually wrapped or plated. Students are expected to practice social distancing and wear masks at all times except for when eating/drinking.


# Special Education Department Receives Transition Grant

The Special Education Department recently received a Transition Readiness grant from the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction that allowed them to purchase a new van for their transition program! We were one of 41 districts throughout the state that received a portion of \$1.5 million in grants. The program is designed to support Wisconsin students with disabilities and to help them successfully transition to competitive work and post-secondary education environments after high school.

The van will be used to transport our middle school and high school students to job shadowing experiences, volunteer work, work experience, and other independent living activities. We are so grateful to have received this grant, and we know it will help us to enrich our student's experiences outside of the classroom.
