I want to thank all of you for a tremendous start to the school year! Attached in this newsletter are our drop-off/pick-up procedures. School safety begins before our students walk through the door. It is our goal to create an organized flow of traffic and parking to maximize safety and security. Thank you for your cooperation!

Our goal daily is to keep our building as safe as it can be for our students and staff. As you enter the elementary school during the day, we kindly ask that all parents, guardians, and visitors check into the main office, sign in, and wear a visitor badge. It is great to see visitors in the building and support our school, and we highly encourage this participation. We appreciate your cooperation and attention to helping keep our building safe!

Our Walking School Bus started on Friday, September 14th, and will continue to run on the Fridays that we have school through the end of November. This is an outstanding way for our students to share some camaraderie in the mornings prior to school starting and get to know some people throughout our community. ## West Salem Elementary Drop Off, Pick Up, and Building Procedures

#### DROP OFF 7:30-8:00

- Parents may drop students off in either parking lot beginning at 7:30 a.m. When entering either parking lot PULL AS FAR FORWARD AS POSSIBLE to ease traffic congestion.
- If a car has not pulled forward and there is space ahead, please pass slowly and move as far forward as possible.
- Pull over to the sidewalk to drop off, staying in a single line of traffic. DO NOT DOUBLE
   PARK! Forming a second line puts students at risk, as students must cross traffic to
   reach the sidewalk.
- Have your child/children ready to exit the vehicle when you are in the drop off lane. Have backpacks on laps, ready to get out of the car quickly, so those behind you do not need to wait.
- Children should exit the vehicle on the passenger side to avoid traffic and should go directly to the designated playground. K, 1, & 2 students are on the south playground, and grades 3 & 4 are on the north playground.
- Do not exit your vehicle or leave your vehicle unattended in the drop off lane for any reason. If you need to come into the building, or assist your child/children, you need to park in a designated parking space.

#### DROP OFF FOR BREAKFAST 7:15-8:00

- Parents may drop students off in the north parking lot (gym side) and students enter in door E.
- Those students getting dropped off in the south lot (kindergarten end) should walk on the sidewalk in front of the building and enter through door B.

#### DROP OFF AFTER 8:00 a.m.

- School starts at 8:00 am. When the bell rings, children enter the building and the doors are locked immediately behind them for building security. Children who arrive after 8:00 a.m. need to enter through the main office for a tardy pass. We do not want your child/children to get locked out, so please do not send them running to catch up to the class. To ensure that your child is not tardy for school, please arrive 5-10 minutes prior to the start of the school day.
- Beginning at 8:00 a.m. there are several 15 minute temporary parking spaces in the front loop. The loop closes again for buses at the conclusion of the day from 2:50 until buses have departed.

#### STUDENT DISMISSAL/PICK UP 3:10

- Parents may pick students up in either parking lot. The south playground blacktop is also available for overflow parking at dismissal. Please park in rows, leaving enough room for cars to back up and pull out. Also leave a lane open for cars to enter and exit around the outside.
- The school playgrounds are closed to visitors during the school day. The playgrounds
  reopen for public use after the buses have been dismissed at 3:20. Children are not
  allowed to play on either playground at dismissal. Please inform any family members
  (Grandparents, siblings, etc.) who do not receive school Skyward messages of our school
  procedures.
- When exiting the south parking lot, we ask that you turn left on Mark St and when
  exiting our north parking lot, we ask that you turn right onto Mark St. This will help the
  flow of traffic and help to alleviate backing up in our lots.

#### ARE YOU READY FOR FLU SEASON?

As we head into winter and spend more time inside buildings, the flu season pays us a Wisconsin visit. Flu is a layman term for the influenza viral infection. The virus is transmitted by coughing, sneezing, contact with used tissues or contaminated hands and objects. The symptoms of influenza include:

- Fever with body temperature 100 degrees Fahrenheit or more
- Common respiratory problems such as cold and cough
- Congestion and runny nose
- Headache accompanied by muscle pains
- Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Chills and Fatigue

Prevention can be your best defense. Teach your child proper coughing and sneezing etiquette by using the inside of your elbow instead of you hand. Encourage proper disposal of tissues. Keep hands away for the face area. Frequent hand washing can also be helpful to decrease the spread of infection. Stay home when you are ill. Get plenty of rest and eating a balance. Talk with your medical provider or health department and consider receiving the influenza vaccine to help prevent the influenza infection.
