West Salem High School Receives Technical Education Equipment Grant

The district is thrilled to announce that West Salem High School will be receiving over \$46,000 from the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development's Fast Forward Technical Equipment Assistance Grants to allow us to purchase new equipment for our metals program! DWD has allocated \$1.14 million dollars to reimburse school districts for the purchase and installation costs of technical education equipment used in vocational training and technical education in advanced manufacturing fields.

The high school plans to purchase a CNC plasma cutter and new welders using these funds. This equipment will allow more students to participate in welding classes, as well as add instruction in using a CNC plasma cutter, which will be a brand new piece of equipment for the district.

Thanks to this grant, we will be able to update our metals lab, expand our course offerings, and benefit more students looking to go into the trades after high school! We also hope to create partnerships with our local businesses seeking employees in these areas. Another great way we are making sure our students are college, career and life ready!


