Letter from Superintendent

Troy Gunderson

October is Finance Month

The annual school district budget is essentially a tenmonth process. The work typically begins in January each year with a required student count and concludes with a flurry of activity during the following October that includes the Annual District Meeting, final budget adoption, and setting of the tax levy.

The school district will receive three key final pieces of data prior to completing the budget process. First, the district will complete the required "Third Friday" September student enrollment count during the last week of September. A preliminary review suggests a healthy increase of approximately 40 students across the district. Secondly, the district will receive an updated property value report from the Department of Revenue in early October. A combination of new construction, updated assessments, and increasing property values suggests a rate of growth similar to recent years. Finally, the Department of Public Instruction will provide an Equalization Aid total on October 15th. The amount is based upon enrollment totals, district property values, and the audited budget totals from the last school year. These three key numbers will be entered into the State

of Wisconsin Revenue Limit Worksheet to establish final revenue and tax levy numbers. Final board action will take place on October 28th.

Changes for the 2019 – 2020 budget cycle include a successful referendum last April allowing the school district to exceed the revenue limit by \$1.6 million and an unexpected change in the state budget allowing low-spending districts like West Salem to increase their revenue limit by an additional \$300 per student. The combination of these two factors will allow the district more flexibility in establishing a final budget and setting the final tax levy.

Referendum materials distributed prior to the April referendum included a proposed list of budget items and tax implications. The budget items included annual salary increases, an annual bus purchase, increased maintenance costs, saving for a high school roof replacement, and closing the budget deficit. Thus far in the 2019 – 2020 budget development process, the district purchased a new bus, increased wages in accordance with a four-year plan, set aside initial funding for the roofing project, increased the budget for maintenance, and eliminated the overall budget deficit. The estimated tax increase connected to the referendum was \$.65 on the Mil Rate or \$65 per \$100,000 worth of property. By all current estimates, it appears the district will meet

the tax levy goal. The district is committed to meeting the expectations included with the referendum last spring by keeping the promises made. We believe this to be the best way to honor your generosity and maintain your trust. Thank you.

I encourage you to attend the Annual District Meeting on Monday, October 28th beginning with the Budget Hearing at 6:00pm in the Heider Meeting

Room located within the school district office. This is a great way to learn more about the annual district budget and budgeting process.

Thank you for reading and thank you for your continued support of public education.

West Salem Excels on State Assessments

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction has released the results of the Wisconsin Student Assessment Exams from the 2018-2019 school year, and the School District of West Salem improved their results significantly in almost all areas. Students at West Salem Elementary Middle and High Schools exceeded the state averages for all four core subjects tested for in the exams, including English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies. The most notable improvement was an over 10% increase in math proficiency across all grades, jumping from 49.5% in 2017-2018 to 60.7% in 2018-2019. Students also improved their proficiency in English language arts and science, while scores dropped slightly in social studies. West Salem High School students taking the ACT averaged a score of 21.2, beating the state average of 19.6.


