Date: October 22, 2020 Subject: Learning Mode Update

The School District of West Salem will be providing weekly updates on the COVID-19 condition in the County and the anticipated future learning modes for students. The School District will be using a <u>decision matrix</u> based upon the <u>Harvard Global Health Institute</u> and the <u>Minnesota Safe Learning Plan</u> to determine the mode of learning for students.

Future Mode of Learning

The primary metrics show that we will be in ORANGE category for this upcoming week as we have had an increase in the cases within our municipality. We will remain in-person instruction for our 4K-5 students, and our blended learning model for grades 6-12.

The secondary metrics indicate the COVID-19 conditions in La Crosse County have remained steady. We will continue to monitor our environment and make decisions as needed. Although we are planning on being back for multiple weeks, please know that classrooms and buildings could move to virtual learning for a period of time if we would reach thresholds determined by the La Crosse County Health Department. Classrooms and schools may be closed as a result of staffing shortages that prevent safe operations or the inability to conduct contact tracing.

Data

On Wednesday, October 21, 2020, the La Crosse County Health Department reported the following COVID-19 metrics and numbers that are used to aid the School District in determining the mode of learning:
