Date: December 10, 2020 Subject: Learning Mode Update

The School District of West Salem will be providing weekly updates on the COVID-19 condition in the County and the anticipated future learning modes for students. The School District has been using a <u>decision matrix</u> based upon the <u>Harvard Global Health Institute</u> and the <u>Minnesota Safe Learning Plan</u> to determine the mode of learning for students.

## **Future Mode of Learning**

The primary metrics show that we remain the RED category in our West Salem community this past week. However, conditions are improving in our area. This is an excellent sign!

The secondary metrics indicate the COVID-19 conditions in La Crosse County also remain in the RED category, but the numbers for our county have also continued to improve over the past couple of weeks. Updates on both the municipality and county data can be found on our COVID-19 Dashboard. We will monitor the trend of the data and make informed decisions in order to get our students back on campus as soon as possible.

## Data

On Wednesday, December 9, 2020, the La Crosse County Health Department reported the following COVID-19 metrics and numbers that are used to aid the School District in determining the mode of learning:
